MESSAGES

Learning Theme -Ten Days of Chinese New Year!

It is a very special time of the year here for us here in China. Chinese New Year is finally here and we will be learning about this wonderful culture over 10 days. We will be thinking about the coming Year of the Sheep and talking about how and why the New Year is celebrated and some of the traditions that are observed. We will be making dumplings, which will be led by our Mandarin staff.



Key Vocabulary: Chinese New Year, red, race, sheep, wishing tree, dumplings.

Literacy:

The children will be writing wishes for our Chinese 'Wishing Tree'. Please prepare your child by talking to him/her about some of the things that he/she would like to wish for. We will be listening to traditional stories about Chinese New Year, including the Great Race which the children will be encouraged to act out together.

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Phonics

Children will continue to play games associated with alliteration and listen to rhyming stories and songs throughout the week. We will be identifying the initial sounds in words and exploring how we can create a rhyming string.

Mathematics:

Our mathematic focus this week will be concentrating on capacity, including pouring with different materials. Which containers are 'full' and 'empty' and which containers have 'more' and 'less'? How many small cups of water will we need to fill the larger container? How many dumplings will fit into each container?

Expressive Arts & Design:

The children will be modelling collaboratively with a range of materials to make sheep and dragon puppets. We will be listening to Chinese music and songs and learning about how people express themselves in different ways.

Mandarin

We will continue to learn about Chinese New Year. Children will take part in a variety of activities related to Chinese New Year. They will learn how to write the spring festival couplet, make red wallets and yummy dumplings! We will also learn a new song called "Gongxi, Gongxi"
