Get ready for the next challenge - your student leaders will be opening the next mystery package later on this month... what do you think it could be?



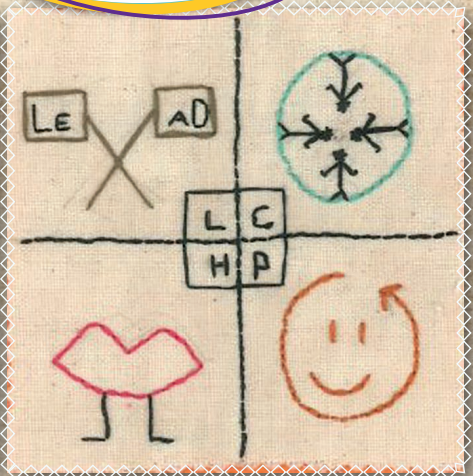
