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


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Year 8 Team



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Various activities, assemblies and information giving takes place during the registration period and it is also an important time for students to update their BIS AD Diploma to reflect on their successes and progress. If you have any questions or concerns about your son / daughter, you should contact the form tutor in the first instance.



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For the first half of term 1, year 8 will be studying a unit called 'Writing in the 21st Century.' This unit will explore how writing has changed throughout the years and challenge students to have a go at writing in some new '21st century' styles. This will include blogging, online articles and listicles as well as exploring the role things such as emojis play in our society and how they have impacted us as communicators. Students will access a range of high quality reading in order to aid their understanding of this unit.

In the second half of term 2, students will study a unit called 'Women's Poetry.' In this unit, students will study and learn about a variety of female poets from many different backgrounds and time periods. Some include Carol Ann Duffy, Maya Angelou, Christina Rosetti and Grace Nichols. Students will both read their poems and learn about their lives and what inspired them to write. They will analyse their poetry and write mini essays exploring the impact of different language and context choices.

Throughout both units, students will be assessed formatively on their ability to analyse ideas and perspectives, write using a range of vocabulary, use correct spelling and punctuation as well as they ability to take part in individual and group discussion.



How can I support at home?

- Discuss the texts being studied with your child – what is your perspective of them and how does it differ from your child's?
- Choose 1 or 2 news articles a week to discuss with your child. Focus on helping them form logical arguments and points by questioning their knowledge of the topic and helping them understand the global issue behind it.

How can I support at home?

All students will be issued with a homework pack via Teams and email at the start of term 1. This pack will contain 3 sections: revision, retention and extension. The revision section has lots of worksheets revising key year 7 content and the retention section focuses on the main questions we want students to be able to answer by the end of Year 8. This pack will contain lots of repetitive work sheets designed to allow students to memorise key concepts and algorithms. The extension section will feature problem solving questions from the UKMT. These sheets should be used when students are scoring higher than 80% on tests and need more challenge than the retention sheets.

What will students study in Term 1?

In Year 8 students will study a range of topics in all the key strands of mathematics. Students in the top sets will also practise for the UKMT Junior Challenge and this will involve developing techniques for problem solving. All students will be assessed on the same content. The topics in Term 1 will be:

- **1. Fractions:** Add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions given as mixed numbers. Students should be able to leave their answer as a mixed number, improper fraction or decimal.
- 2. Expressions and Formulae: Be able to expand brackets multiplied by a single term and simplify the result by collecting like terms. Substitute integers, decimals & fractions into formulae and calculate an answer.
- **3. Sequences:** be able to generate terms of arithmetic, geometric and Fibonacci sequences.
- **4. Polygons:** Understand and use the properties of a parallelogram, rectangle, square, rhombus, trapezium, isosceles trapezium and kite
- 5. Ratio and proportion: Use ratio notation, including reduction to its simplest form and its various links to fraction notation. Divide a quantity in a given ratio or ratios.
- **6. Statistical Measures:** Calculate the mean and range from a frequency table.
- **7. Linear Equations:** Construct and solve linear equations, with integer coefficients, in one unknown in which the unknown appears on either side or both sides of the equation.
- **8. Area and Perimeter:** Find the area of parallelograms and trapezia. Find circumferences and areas of circles using relevant formulae; find perimeters and areas of semicircles.

How can I extend my child?

To extend your child beyond the school curriculum please encourage them to read and solve problems as much as possible. Some of our more able students also enjoy coding solutions on computers and this is an excellent way to develop lateral thinking skills. The following books will be of use:

The aim of this course is to introduce students to the Arabic language and to immerse them within Arabic culture. Grammar will be a key focus as it builds the accuracy of the writing and speech.

For this term, the students will complete the theme "Local area, holiday and travel" and will be covering the themes "My Typical day, Daily chores & daily routine."

By the end of the term your son /daughter will have the opportunity to build the language skills through a variety of learning outcomes, which are outlined in the curriculum brief of term 1 and term 2.

Listening:

- Identify the overall message, key points, details, and opinions.
- Deduce meaning from a variety of spoken texts
- Be able to answer questions, extract information, evaluate and draw conclusions.

Reading:

- Identify the overall message, key points, details, and opinions in texts.
- Recognize and respond to key information, important themes, and ideas in more extended written text, including authentic sources, adapted, and abridged as appropriate, by being able to extract information and answer questions.

Writing:

- Communicates information relevant to the task with expansion of key points and ideas.
- Effective adaptation of language to narrate, inform, interest, and give convincing personal opinions.
- Produces frequently extended sentences, well linked together
- Generally accurate language and structures, including successful references to past, present and future events; occasionally errors occur that hinder clarity of communication.

Speaking:

- Unambiguous; pronunciation supports clear communication.
- Responds to the set questions with consistently fluent and developed responses.
- Consistently effective adaptation of language to describe, narrate and inform, in response to the set questions.
- Pronunciation and intonation are consistently accurate and intelligible.

How can I extend my child?

To extend your child beyond the curriculum please encourage your child to read at home. We strongly recommend that all students read for a minimum of twenty minutes every day. They should also practice writing for an extended time periodically, this could be through writing short stories, creating a newspaper article about a key event that has taken place or poetry etc.

The Arabic department in the secondary school will provide support to the extended writing. Therefore, your child may receive writing tasks with instructions that can help him produce good quality of writing. We recommend students get a dictionary, the Arabic bank of vocabulary, grammar books for second language learners like Arabic grammar in context.

What will students study in Term 1?

How can I extend my child?

What will students study in Term 1?

In Year 8 students will continue to study a range of topics designed to meet the National Agenda of UAE. The new curriculum of social sciences provides a coordinated, systematic study of information, skills, and concepts in the disciplines of history, geography, political science, economics, anthropology, psychology, law, archaeology and sociology. Students are learning to make connections between peoples and nations of the world, between science, technology and society and learning to practise good citizenship. Students will be aided to develop informed and well-reasoned decision making as members of a cultured society in an interdependent world. Students will be assessed on a research task, a historical pictorial and a travel guide. Topics in Term 1 will be:

- The dawn of Islam
- The early life of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH)
- Life in Early Islamic Period in the UAE
- The later life and death of the Prophet Muhammad (PBUH)
- The growth of the Islamic Empire
- · The spread of Islam
- Islamic Cities a study of Baghdad in 900AD
- Christopher Columbus and Vasco De Gama
- The tribal origins of the modern UAE

How can I extend my child?

- Sound & The Ear

- Making Waves
- Particle Theory
- Measuring Wave Speed
- Light Colour & Transmission

Fairground Physics

- Simple Circuits
- Pressure
- Moments
- Magnets

Students will also have the opportunity to complete an MIT challenge, this term along with MIT Abstracts, MIT Home Labs and Global Campus Challenges. Please encourage your child to sign up for the CREST Award CCA this term.

How can I extend my child?

What will students study in Term 1?

In Year 8 Geography students will be studying

Coasts and Oceans. This unit begins with a focus on

Physical Geography. Students will be learning about the processes involved in the formation of coastal

landforms and general oceanography. The unit then continues with a more human focus on management

of coastal and ocean resources and the protection of marine environments. Key areas of study are as follows:

- The management of coastal developments and conflicts
- The value of oceans
- Coral Reefs
- Mangroves
- Threats to Oceans overfishing, ocean plastics & oil

Students will be assessed on their overall knowledge of the coasts section; they will also complete a decisionmaking exercise and create an aquarium display for the Threats to Oceans area of the syllabus.



- Vasco de Gama navigation and interaction between Europe and Asia
- Hernan Cortes and Francisco Pizarro what do the available sources tell us about the motivations of the conquistadors?
- Amerigo Vespucci cartography in the Age of Discovery
- John Smith the interaction of different cultures and societies in the Age of Discovery
- Jacques Cartier the first French empire
- Francis Drake- the clash between Catholic Spain and Protestant England
- The Dutch East Indies Company the growth of a modern company
- The English East Indies Company the English conquest of India
- The Mughal Empire the domination of the Indian subcontinent by the Mughals
- The Golden Age of Piracy how did bandits take advantage of the wealth transported on the open seas?

How can I extend my child?


Although the examination will only assess a small selection of specified points directly, students who engage in wider reading about the topic always have a much firmer grasp of the period being studied than those who don't.

The two books below are very broad and engaging reads on topics that will be assessed, and they go beyond the curriculum in ways that will help students develop a better picture of the world on in the Age of Discovery.

How can I extend my child?

Databases have many uses they extend well beyond the classroom. It would be useful for you to consider examples in your own line of work of how a database might be used and share this with your child. You may consider asking them to build you a simple database for something at home or for a local sports club. This could include...

- Keeping track of contact details for a local sports club
- A calendar of key family events through the year

What will students study in Term 1?

During this term student will learn about how computers can be used to keep track of equipment and supplies within construction. They will do this by building a single table, flat-file, database in Microsoft Access. They will then learn the engineering skills involved with pneumatics. This will include the advantages that pneumatics bring to a construction site over alternative methods of getting the work completed.

Students will then be given an engineering challenge to complete where they must combine all their skills. They must use our Lego Pneumatics equipment to build a solution to the given problem whilst thinking about the cost of their design by producing a database that keeps track of the components used and calculates the cost of their design. Finally students will be given the opportunity to refine their design in attempt to produce the most efficient, and cost effective, solution.

The database skills covered in this unit of work include:

- Data types
- Use of data dictionaries (for a single flat file database)
- Basic validation rules
- Queries and basic queries criterion (using QBE)
- Building reports to share findings.

How can I support at home?

Homework in STEAM is more than just additional work to complete at home. There is only one homework task and this is optional. It is designed to be completed as a family, that is, the focus of this homework is to engage your child outside of school with what they have learnt in their lessons.

It shouldn't be onerous or hard work. Instead it should be a starting point to an investigation whilst you are out or a good excuse to talk about what your child has been doing in lessons.

The task -

"Visit the Dubai Municipality Museum in Deira, Dubai. Find out about the planning and construction required in the early days of Dubai and what helped towards the development of the Emirates. Entry is free. Ask you teacher for direction and further details."

Students will explore continuous line through wire sculpture and be investigating how patterns are created, where they can be found and how they are used. The work of Henry Moore will be explored to consider how contour lines describe form and students will experiment with wax and water colour resist.

Students will create a detailed observational drawing of distorted fabric patterns, practise effective water colour application techniques for applying tone and achieve a realistic 3D effect in their painting.

Students will progress to exploring how positive shape and negative space can be used in artwork and create their own work experimenting with this technique.



Term Two: Oct - Dec

Skills in Practice

In the second half term students will put into practice the skills they have developed in the first half term to create a short, original piece of Drama using a stimulus. The process of creating and the final performance will be assessed using the Nord Anglia Performing Arts Learner Ambitions (PALA) assessment framework.

Ways of Being - Collaborative

Students can identify and embody the roles of actor, director, designer, writer in their own simple theatrical collaboration.

Ways of Thinking - Creative

Students can create a piece of drama by selecting and combining techniques and forms together in a novel way.

Ways of Doing - Performers

Students understand how dramatic exercises and techniques can be applied to a performance or dramatic work.

Half the students taking Drama achieved a grade 7 or higher in Aug 2021.

How can I support at home?

Encourage your child to see theatre productions. Students will explore the world of Shakespeare and heightened language during Unit 2, Much Ado About Nothing by William Shakespeare will be playing at Dubai Opera in September.

Theatre in the UAE is developing, and by offering as many opportunities to see live theatre as possible you will be enriching your child's cultural knowledge.

How can I support at home?

Students will be given listening tasks to test their ability to identify and appraise the elements of music and compositional techniques used.

Resources such as instrumental practice worksheets and links will also be provided via Teams to complement classroom

Students should endeavour to make links between the structures, cultures and compositional techniques used and will be encouraged to make links between rudiments of music used.

Reflection of own culture and music from home countries should be encouraged.



What will students study in Term 1?

Music will be taught with a focus on practical skills supported by theoretical concepts. Students will be encouraged to explore their creativity, self-expression and develop physical skills required to produce music using their voices, body movements, instruments and digital music technology.

Riffin' Awesome! is the Term 1 project designed to inspire Year 8 students to continue building their skills playing musical instruments through a variety of practical, hands-on activities. Based around the concept of musical patterns, students will embark on an exciting journey from the montuno of Cuba, 'licks' and grooves heard in American jazz, through to guitar riffs in western pop, rock and beyond. Students will be taught how to experiment with instruments and timbres to further develop their artistic voices.

This project will cover the following Nord Anglia Performing Arts Learner Ambitions:

- Creativity experimentation and risk-taking as musical artists, improvising using an increasing range
- Performing learning ways to balance technical and artistic goals, being reflective practitioners.
- **Artistic perception** express personal interpretations and draw connections between different kinds of musical response.

The second half of Term 1 will involve learning how to record and arrange their own music, incorporating elements of acoustic sound production with the advantages offered by digital music technology. Students will deepen their understanding of specific applications of technology in music production and their uses in the professional music industry.

Student will develop their learning in this half term through the following Nord Anglia Performing Arts Ambitions:

- Musical literacy discuss a range of roles existing within the music profession.
- Curiosity ask insightful and perceptive questions about their own learning, comparing multiple viewpoints.
- Perception draw comparisons between sections and layers and discuss how the music develops over time.

How can I extend my child?

To extend your child beyond the school curriculum, please encourage them to attend the wide range of Creative Arts extra- curricular activities that the school provides.

- YouTube is an excellent resource for listening skills as well as for musical instrument tutorials.
- **Musictheory.net** is great for extending your child's grasp of music theory and notation.

In Year 8, students will continue to undertake a skills-based unit that will encourage them to not only maintain their physical activity levels through physical training sessions but also aim to develop technically across a range of units that will be covered.

Each week there will continue to be a unit specific focus on both the physical and skill-related fitness components alongside skills challenges aimed at developing the technical ability of the students. Throughout the unit, tasks will be related to the below concepts:

- Invasion games (Netball, Basketball & Football)
- Striking & Fielding games (Cricket, Rounders, Softball)
- Net & Wall games (Tennis)

There will be a continuation o the collaborative tasks that students will need to complete each lesson using the platforms of Microsoft Teams and OneNote. During the collaboration opportunities, students need to reflect on which skills they would like to develop and in turn complete the relevant collaborative tasks set.

Online learners will also be required to participate in the lesson practically, as a result they are required to wear sports clothes in a safe environment.

How can I extend my child?
