

Core or Extended?



The vast majority of all of our students will take all of their (I)GCSEs at Extended level.

For some, in the subjects that they find the most demanding (remember, we cannot all be amazing at everything) Core exam entries exist to take the strain off of them.

Although a Core entry cannot achieve higher than a 5. The volume of material needed is less and students can benefit from a less in-depth examination of the subject.

Taking Extended level in a subject that you find difficult can risk your achievement in other subjects as well.

- 2 Number of Authorised absences from tutor time = Number of absences in AM or PM sessions
- 3 Number of Unauthorised absences from tutor time = Number of absences in AM or PM sessions
- 4 Number of mornings late = Number of L (between 07.35 and 08.00) and Number of G (after 08.00)

AUTHORISATION OF STUDENT ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

The school's Attendance Policy, which may be read at www.bsk.edu.kw/attendance, requires students to arrive to school by 07.30 daily, in time for the first bell and they are required to remain at school until 14.35 when they will be released to return home.

The same policy stipulates the rules regarding authorised and unauthorised absence. For secondary students all illness and medical appointments must be accompanied by a note from a medical report, a private clinic receipt or a government clinic doctor's form.

This form should be used in advance of known full or part day absences, as well as retrospectively for unforeseen absence, or late arrival to school.

Section A: To be completed in full by the parent. The form should then be given to the student to submit to their Class Tutor.

- Conduct is the same as Net Positive
- It is calculated by taking the negative points away from the positive points
- The example student above would have a Conduct Score of 4 (50-46)
- A positive score is required to return in the Sixth Form
- We will not allow any student that fails to maintain a Positive score in Year
 11 to return to BSK for further study.



Post 16 Options

- The "Sixth Form" comprises Years 12 and 13 of the British education system.
- Y12: AS Levels (Advanced Subsidiary)
 - Typically four subjects related to the course you wish to study at university.
- Y13: A Levels (Advanced)
 - Some students choose to drop one subject and concentrate on the three most relevant subjects for chosen university course. Others continue with four.

What to Expect

- 5 lessons per week of each subject (not necessarily one each day).
- Students are expected to complete minimum of an hour of independent study for every hour taught in school.
 - 5 hours lessons = 5 hours' independent study.

Conditions of Entry

General Academic Conditions (Minimum)

- 6 subjects at 9-6 (A*-B) at (I)GCSE level
- Minimum grade 6 (B) at (I) GCSE in each subject to be studied in Y12 (AS Level)
- Alternative conditions for subjects not taken at IGCSE.



Conditions of Entry

Additional Considerations

For subjects to be studied at AS Level:

- Minimum Grade 4 (C) in final Y10 report
- Minimum Grade 4 (C) in Y11 Winter report
