Snacks and lunches should be 'healthy', and we ask that no sweets or fizzy drinks are sent to school. Teachers will actively supervise and encourage children's eating but if you have any concerns, please speak to your child's teacher. Please be informed that all lunch boxes will now be kept inside the classrooms where it is cooler.
