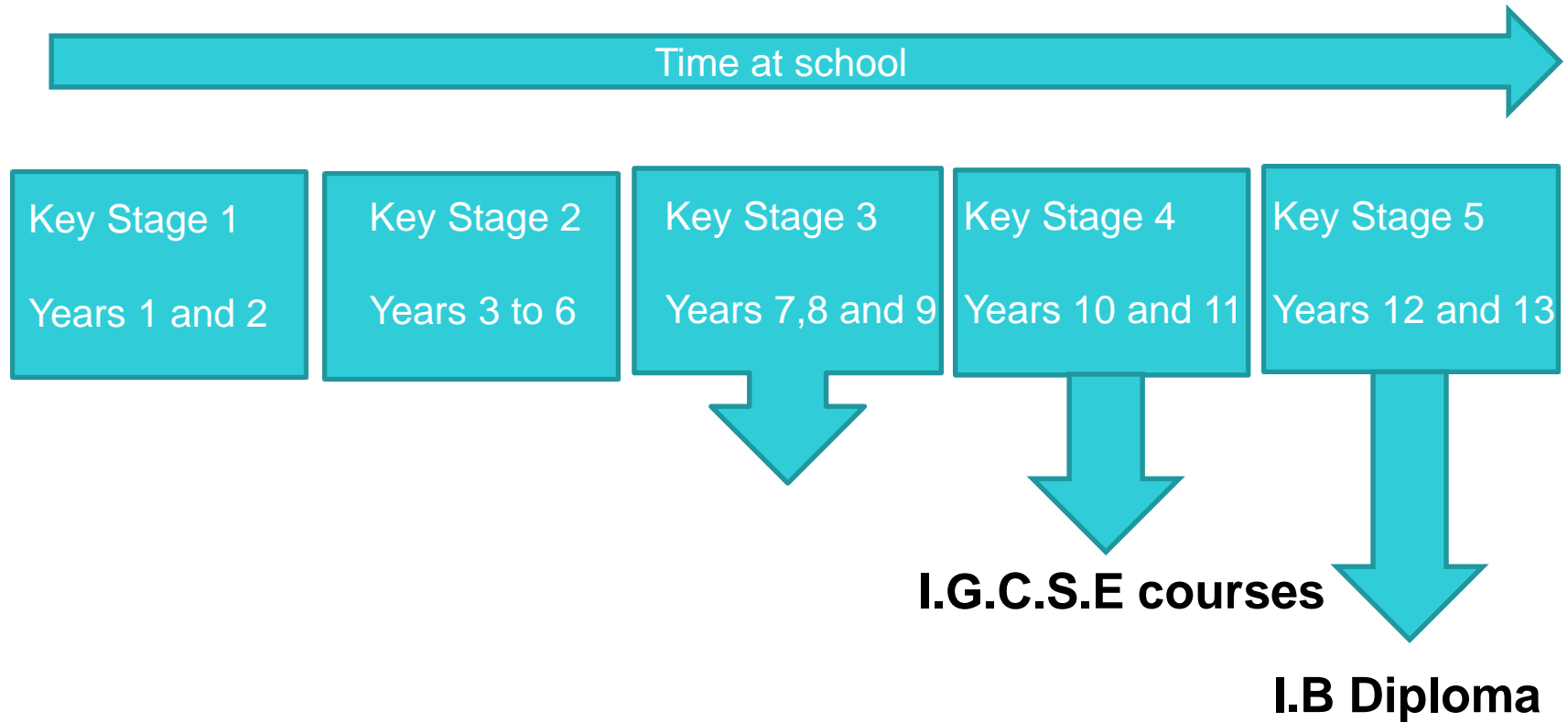
School Profile

- Specialised performing arts curriculum provision created in partnership with the Juilliard School in New York

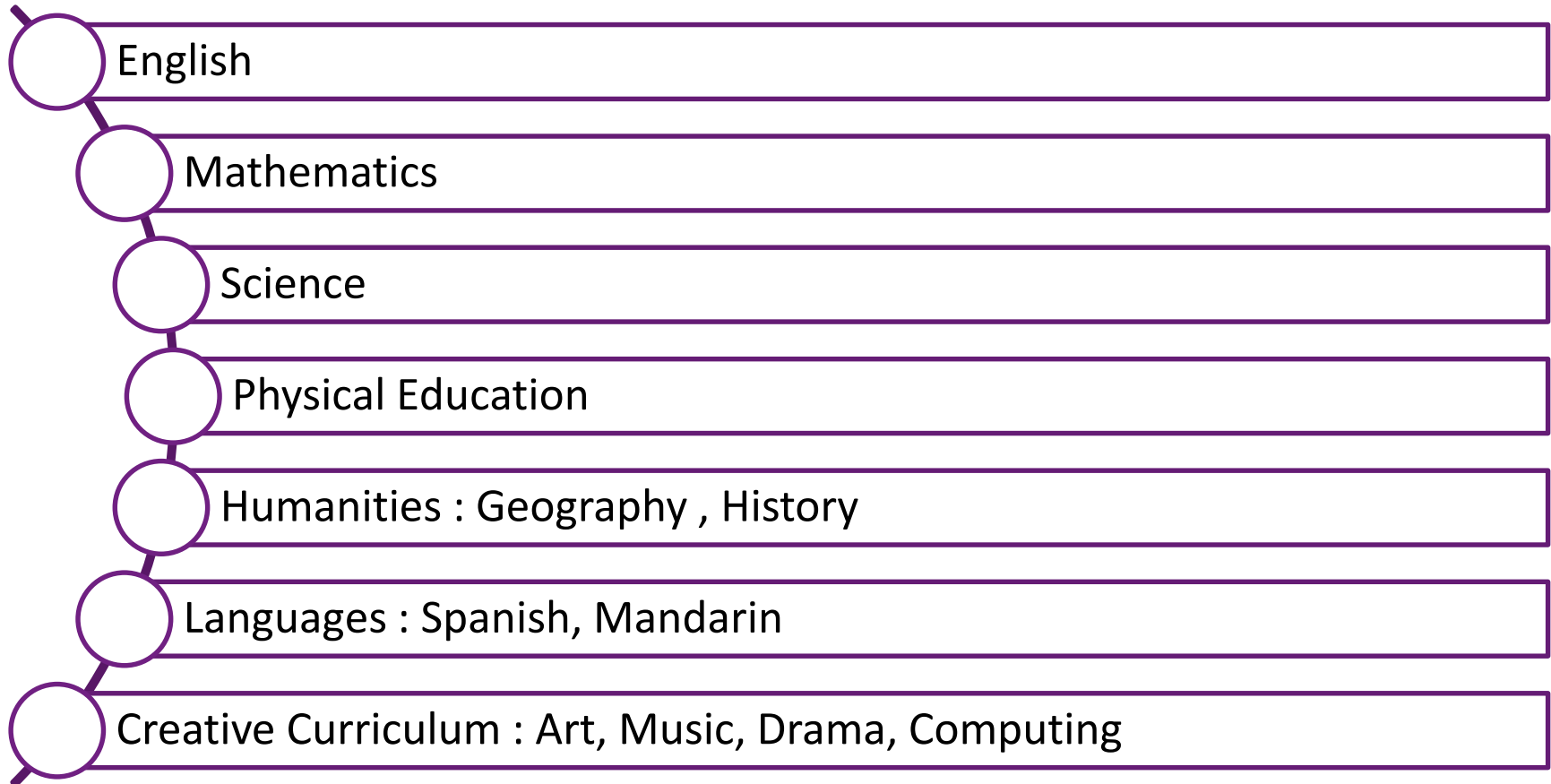

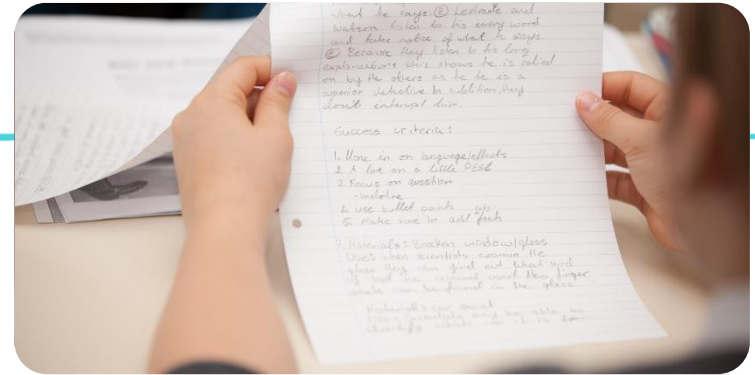

Assessment and reporting



- Assessment at Key Stage 3 is an ongoing process of class quizzes, homework assignments and end of module tests.
- These are tied to the KS3 National Curriculum content for that subject.
- Reporting takes place after the first few months (a 'settling in' report, at the mid-term point and then following the end of year examinations.
- Reports are reviewed by tutors and Heads of House.

2015 Results

- IGCSE – 47% gained A* or A grades (the UK average was 21%)
- IGCSE – 83% gained 5 A - C grades (the UK average was 53%)
(including English and Maths)
- IB Diploma – NAE average – 33.5 points Global average – 29.9 points
12.5% gained over 40 points 7% gained over 40 points
