Co-Curricular Activities (CCAs) are an integral part of the education offered at BIS HCMC and provide our students with a broad range of learning opportunities which positively impact many facets of their development, including academic progress. The diverse co-curricular programme is designed to enhance the core curriculum and provide opportunities for students to broaden their interests and perspectives of the world as they develop a range of skills including social, emotional, leadership, independence, collaboration, moral reasoning, decision making, problem solving, and critical thinking.

All clubs will again run for a 5 week block as follows:

CCAs will run during lunchtimes, however, the majority are scheduled after timetabled lessons.

The Virtual CCA Programme makes provision for two sessions each afternoon from 2:50pm – 3:50pm and from 3:55pm - 4:55pm. If activities take place beyond these times information is detailed in the booklet.

- To continue to develop our involvement in community work
- To offer a balance of endeavour which provides the framework for the IBDP CAS Programme

CAS at BIS

Creativity, Activity and Service are woven throughout the Co-Curricular Activities. Originating from the International Baccalaureate Programme they set out to challenge our students to show initiative and perseverance as well as to develop skills such as collaboration, problem solving and decision making. For a balanced experience, we encourage students to take part in at least one of each of the three areas below:

- **Creativity:** The arts, music, languages and other experiences that involve creative thinking.
- **Activity:** Physical exertion, contributing to a healthy lifestyle.
- **Service:** Any collaborative and reciprocal community engagement in response to an authentic need.

On-line CCA Selection – using SchoolsBuddy

Activities need to be selected using the online SchoolsBuddy system. Please see the next page for further instructions.

You will be able to see updates and changes to your approved activities through your on-line SchoolsBuddy homepage. Both the student and their parents will also receive notification when accepted for participation in a CCA.

For the majority of CCAs, the online system (SchoolsBuddy) will randomly allocate students to each CCA. As it is not a first come first served system, you may not always get your first choice activity.

Paid Activities

There are a few paid activities that students can sign up for such as Football and Gymnastics Conditioning. These are provided by external individuals and organisations with all information about them detailed in this activities booklet. The external providers have collaborated with BIS and understand the importance of their role in supporting the wellbeing of our students by providing meaningful connections and support beyond the context of a virtual classroom. All costs have been limited to under VND 160,000 per session.

If a student has selected a paid activity, an email confirming their choice will be sent to both the student and their parents.

The payment deadline for all paid clubs is Wednesday 20th October 2021.

Due to the current situation in Ho Chi Minh City, payments for paid VCCA options that a student has been accepted into can only be made through online banking. If unable to fulfil these conditions, students should please not sign up for a paid VCCA as an option.

Payment amounts for those clubs which a student has been accepted into will be emailed to students and parents on Wednesday 13th October, with payment the payment deadline being the end Wednesday 20th October 2021.

All VCCAs will start on the week beginning the 1st November 2021. If payment has not been cleared by our accounts team by Monday 25th October, a place will not be available.

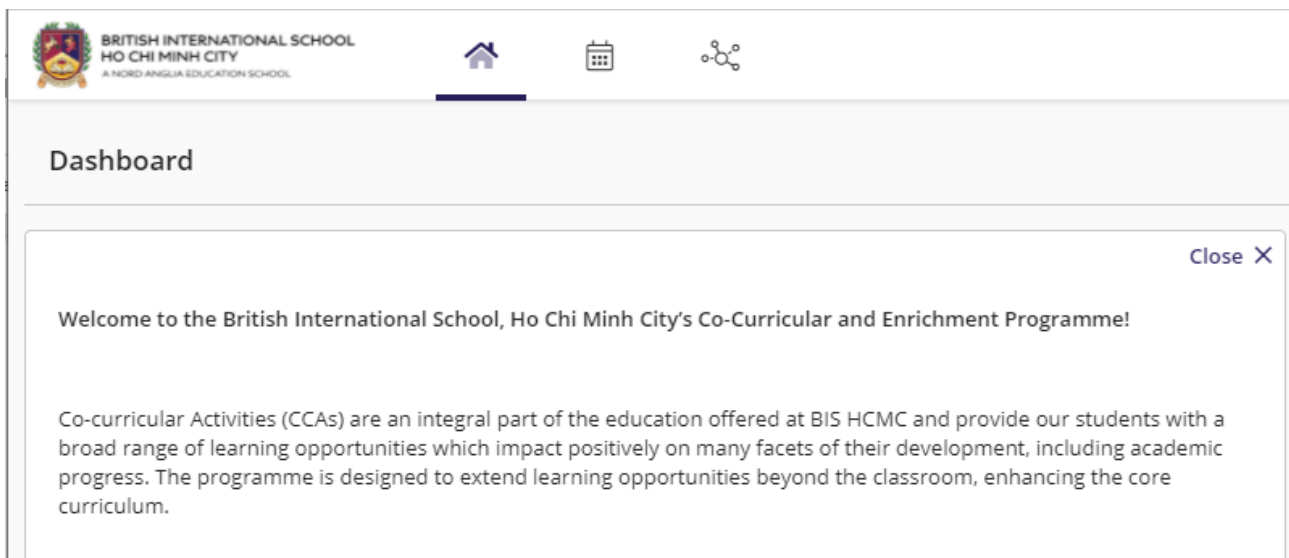



After clicking the link above, you will be directed to the login page. Do not add your email directly to this page, but instead, click on iSAMS (Parent) as seen to the left.

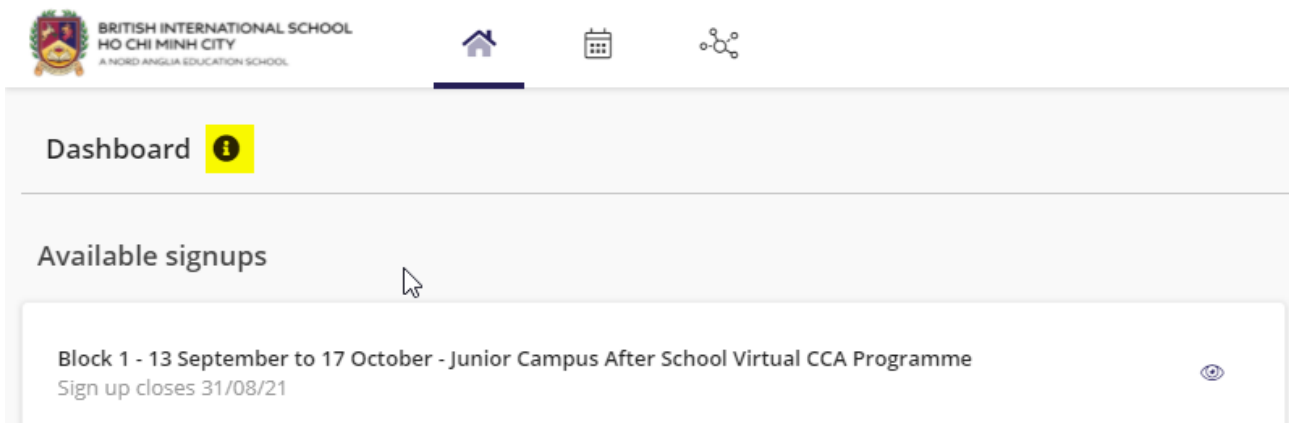
