Each year we carry out an annual parent satisfaction survey to help us improve our understanding of how we are performing in key areas so that we can continue to provide the best possible educational experience for your child.



Creating time and space for independent exploration and creation of books within a classroom allows children to experiment with emergent reading and writing behaviours without the age-old fear of "getting it wrong".


Independent writing helps develop a child's sense of ownership over their skills and
