We hope everyone enjoyed their break, and look forward to hearing about the exciting things you have been doing during Golden Week.


Reminders:

Our learning theme:

We will be introducing our new learning theme "Under the Sea". We will read the story "Commotion in the Ocean" by Giles Andreae and David Wojtowycz. The story tells of a curious commotion, at the bottom of the ocean. Each page includes a fun rhyme about a creature that lives in and around the ocean.





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Key vocabulary: animal, ocean, water, sea

Literacy:

- Children have some favourite stories, rhymes, poems or jingles.
- Children listen to and join in with stories and poems, one to one and also in small groups.

The story of Commotion in the Ocean provides a superb opportunity to introduce lots of animal related vocabulary. We will discuss the different animals in the story and practice saying their names

Key vocabulary: whales, walruses, penguins, polar bears, stingrays, sharks, jellyfish, angelfish.

Mathematics: Numbers

- Uses some language of quantities, such as 'more' and 'a lot'.
- Knows that a group of things changes in quantity when something is added or taken away.
- Selects a small number of objects from a group when asked, for example, 'please give me one', 'please give me two'.
- Recites some number names in sequence.

We will sing the nursery rhyme "One two three four five, once I caught a fish alive", using our fingers to represent the numbers. We will be catching fish with fishing rods and counting how many we have.

Key Vocabulary: how many, one, two, three, four, five

Expressive art and design

Through the continuous provision children will have the opportunity to explore different techniques to create watery scenes.

Key Vocabulary: paint, collage, colour, mix, blue, green, red, yellow, purple, orange, black, white
