Dear Parents/Guardians,

Re: YEAR 10 WORK EXPERIENCE PROGRAMME

Year 10 students are reaching an age where they need to start thinking about their longer term futures. They've started this by choosing GCSE options and studying in areas that interest them, and the next step is an introduction to the world of work. They will complete a Work Experience Programme during our whole school activities week from Monday 15 June –Friday 19 June. During this time, students will join a company in Shanghai to learn more about its operations and roles of the employees.

To tell you more about this, I would like to invite to you to an Information Evening on Thursday 22 January, 6:30pm-7:30pm in the Secondary School auditorium, where I will provide you with more information about the programme.

What is work experience?

Students will spend one week with a company in Shanghai to gain a valuable insight into the world of work through hands on experience. Students will be given appropriate tasks and projects to work on during the week as well as a chance to observe the companies employees.

It is a fantastic opportunity for students to find out more about a particular job/career within a professional setting. It is a chance for students to develop key skills such as working with others, using their initiative and acting responsibly. Work experience may also help students to make important decisions about their own future subject and career options. Work experience is a vital part of your son or daughter's education and we expect all students to participate.

What do parents need to do?

Finding a suitable company/organisation is essential to the programme. It is vital that students complete work experience in a safe and productive environment. Your help with this is much appreciated.

Parents and students will be responsible for finding a placement. This is an ideal opportunity to get the students involved in taking responsibility for their own workplace. We have identified a very small number of companies willing to accept students but, at this stage it is very important students try to make their own arrangements. If, after trying to organise their own placement they cannot we will help, but the placements the school can offer will be limited to those companies who have volunteered to support the programme.

Once you have found a company who agrees to offer work experience to your son/daughter, please provide brief details on the attached form and return to Form Tutors by Monday 23 March. We will then contact the company directly to make all of the arrangements. To ensure that the students get the most out of the experience, we ask that they do not work directly with their own parents.

I look forward to seeing you at the Information Evening next week. We will explain all of this in more detail then, but please feel free to contact me directly if you need any help in finding your son/daughter a work placement, if you are able to offer a placement to one of our students or if you have any other question.
