In Literacy, we will focus on the lovely events planned for International Week! We will look at our place in the world and all the places close to our hearts.

Maths

In Maths this week we will be looking at the value of coins and starting to use them to pay for toys. We will use British pennies and pounds as Chinese Yuan are based around 10 (so there are 10 Mao to the Yuan) while most world currencies are base 100 (100 pennies to the pound, 100 cents to the dollar etc.) so those skills are more transferrable.

Themed Learning

Themed Learning covers our Science, Humanities and Art sessions. Teachers will be adopting a themed learning approach on a weekly or biweekly basis to allow for a more creative, cross-curricular approach to learning. Teachers may highlight specific Science, Humanities and Art skills being covered each week, but generally will provide an overview for the learning block.

Science

Our Science topic this half term is Forces. Children will learn about different sorts of movement and how to describe these. They relate movement to pushes and pulls. The children will experiment with and investigate the effects that forces have on the world around them. They will make observations and communicate these findings to their peers and their teacher.

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Humanities

In this unit children will look at similarities and differences between toys today and toys in the past. It introduces children to the concepts of 'old' and 'new', and encourages them to think about the changes that occur in their own lives and in those of their family or adults around them. The approach used in this unit could be applied to the study of other everyday things from the past, eg clothes, games. The children will have opportunities to develop their speaking and listening skills.

PSHCE

This term we will begin our topic on Relationships. This unit focuses specifically on feelings. It explores feelings within the context of our important relationships including family and friends. The theme aims to develop knowledge, understanding and skills in three social and emotional aspects of learning: self-awareness, managing feelings and empathy.

Art

In this unit the children will be transferring their knowledge of materials from our previous topic in Science to look at playground equipment. They will then design and make a piece of playground equipment using a variety of materials and joining, cutting and folding skills.
