The youngest students in the school joined in with a wonderful sensory and messy activity - painting with our feet! We walked around the whole world to create our art work!

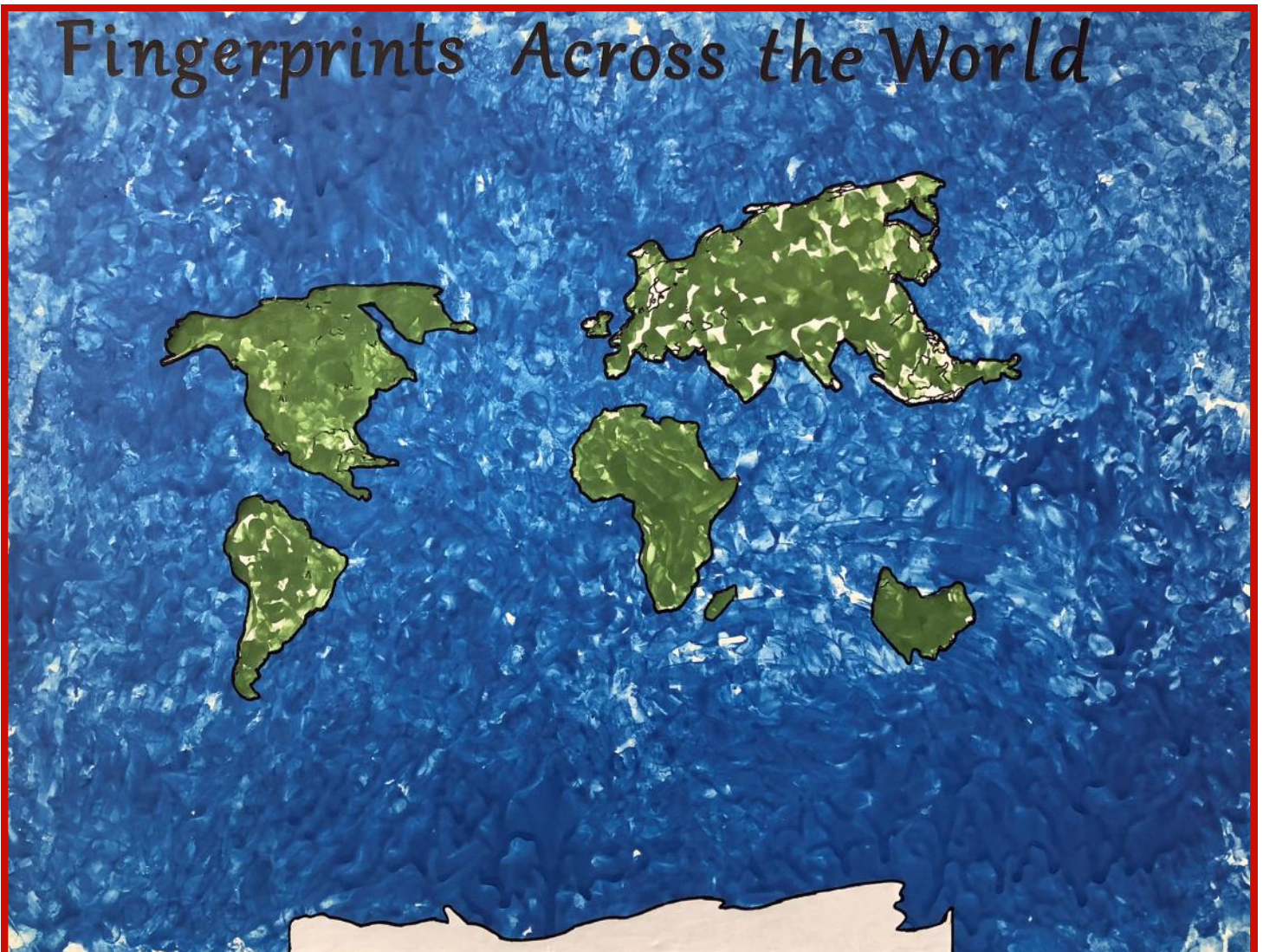


Pre-Nursery Starfish 'Fingerprints across the World'

'Travel The Globe!'

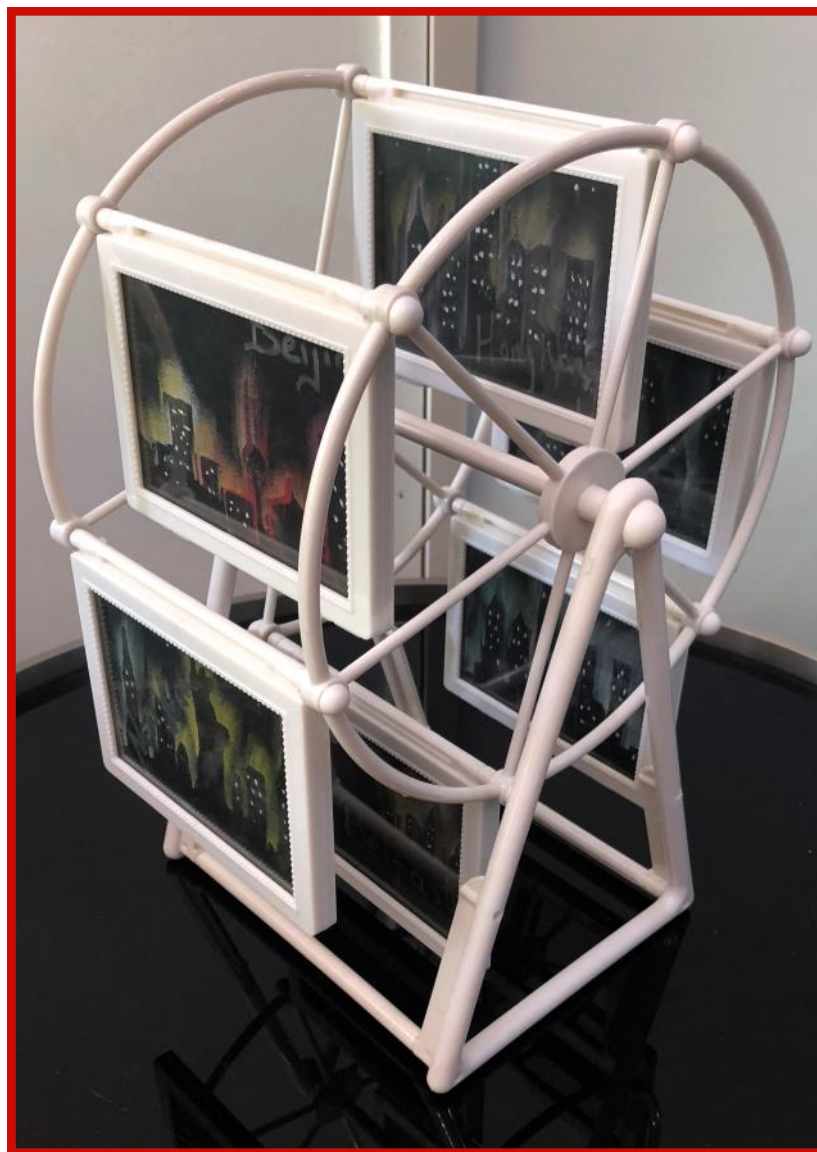

'In the heart of the City'

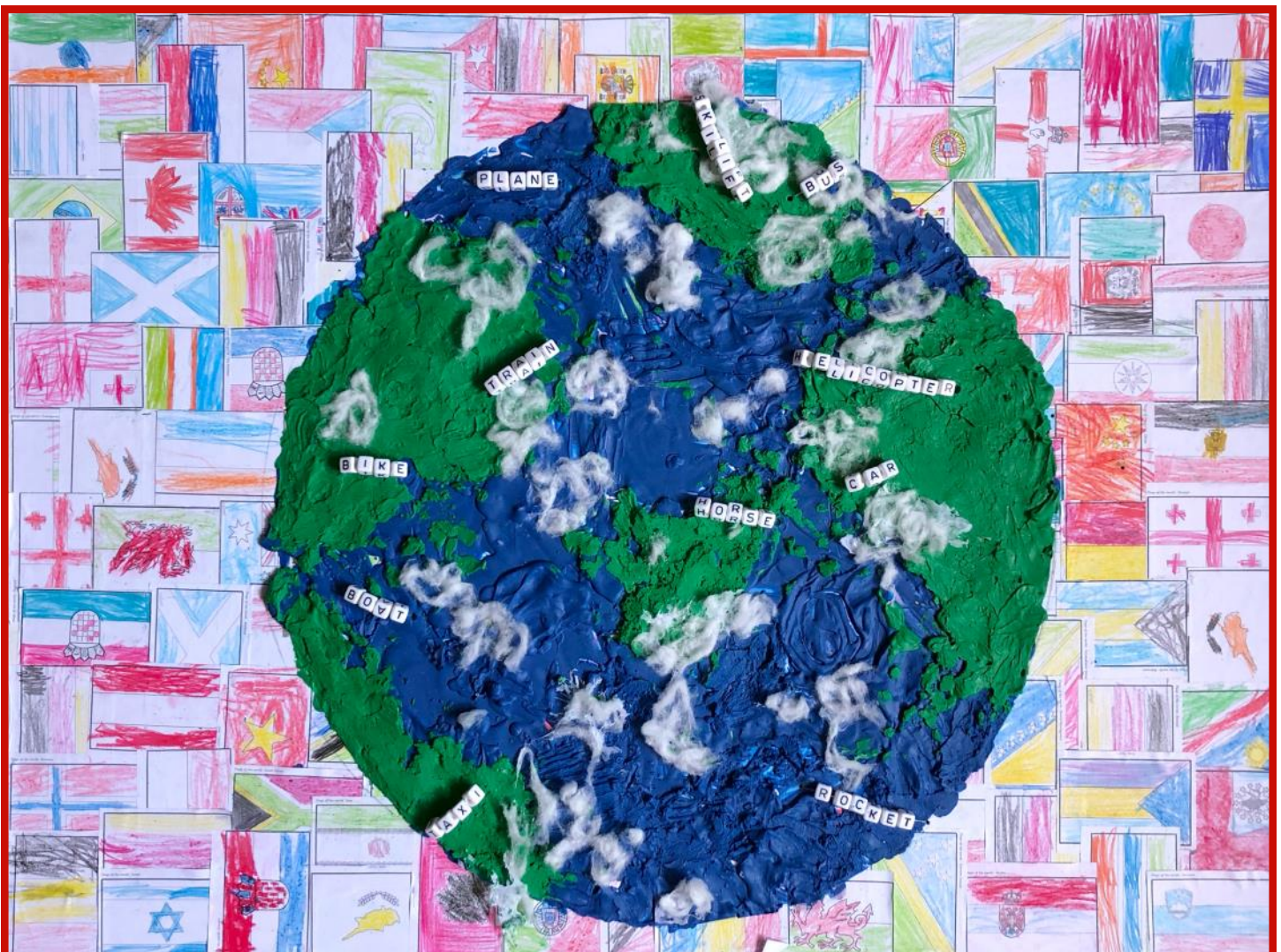

'A World Full of Colours'

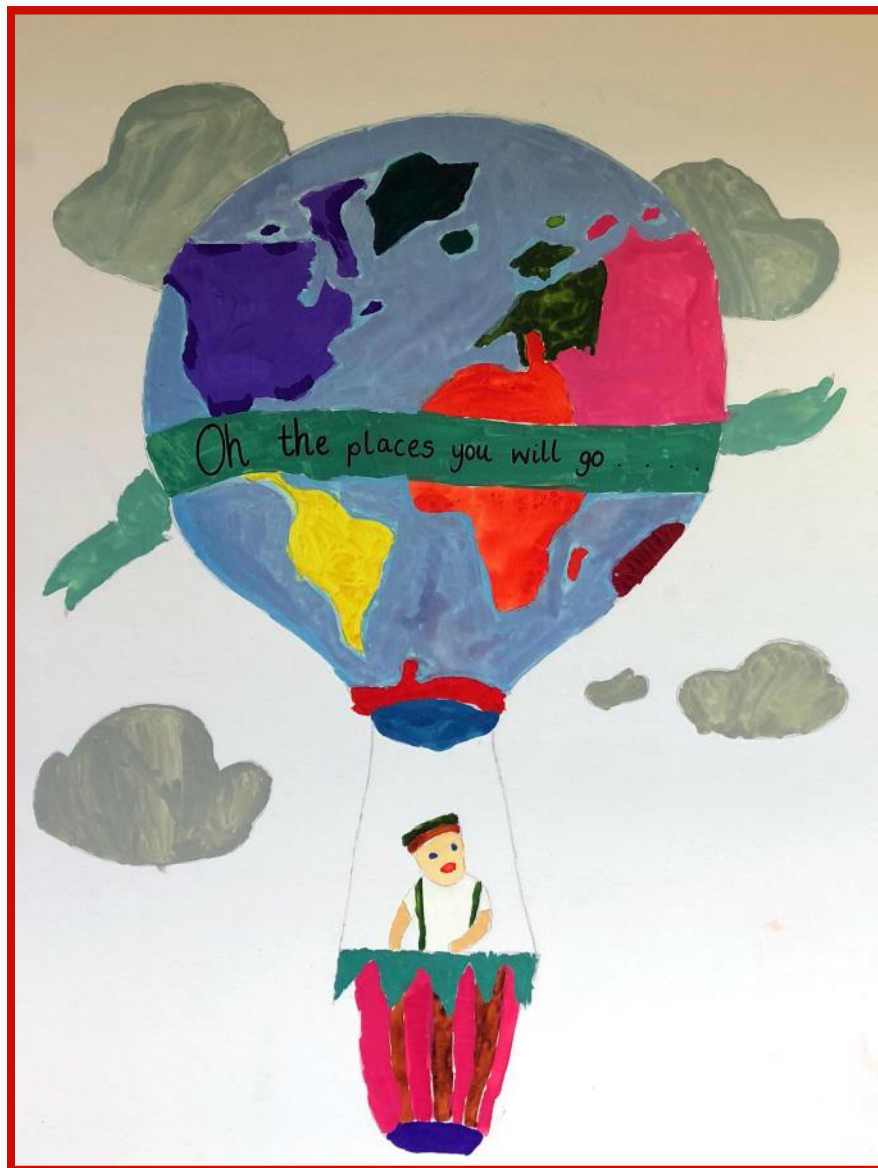
The Sharks are so interested in our beautiful home and wanted to create a vibrant picture that demonstrates just how special our planet really is!

'Culture Tree'

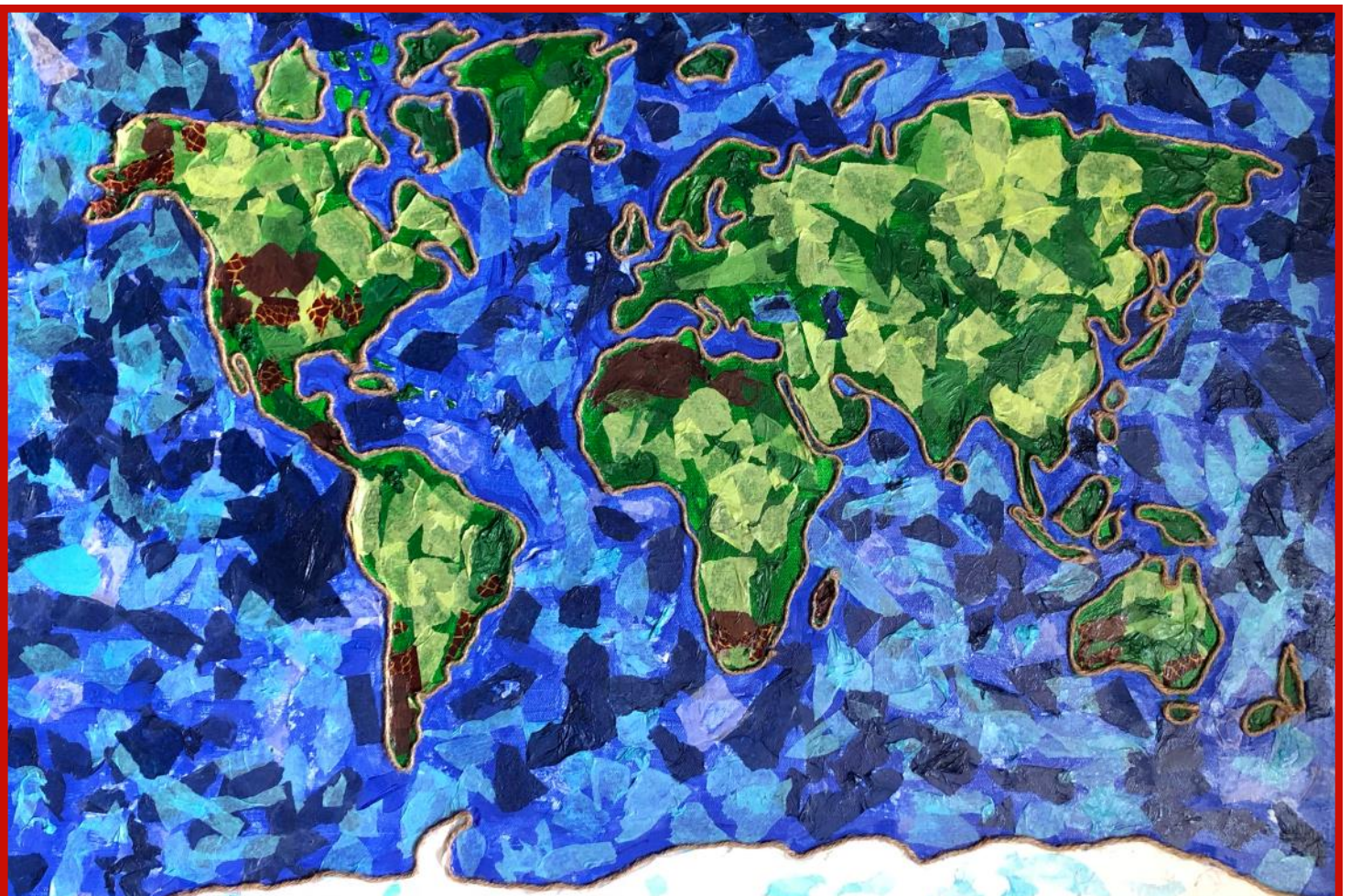

This is a wonderful piece of art that is certain to brighten up any home.



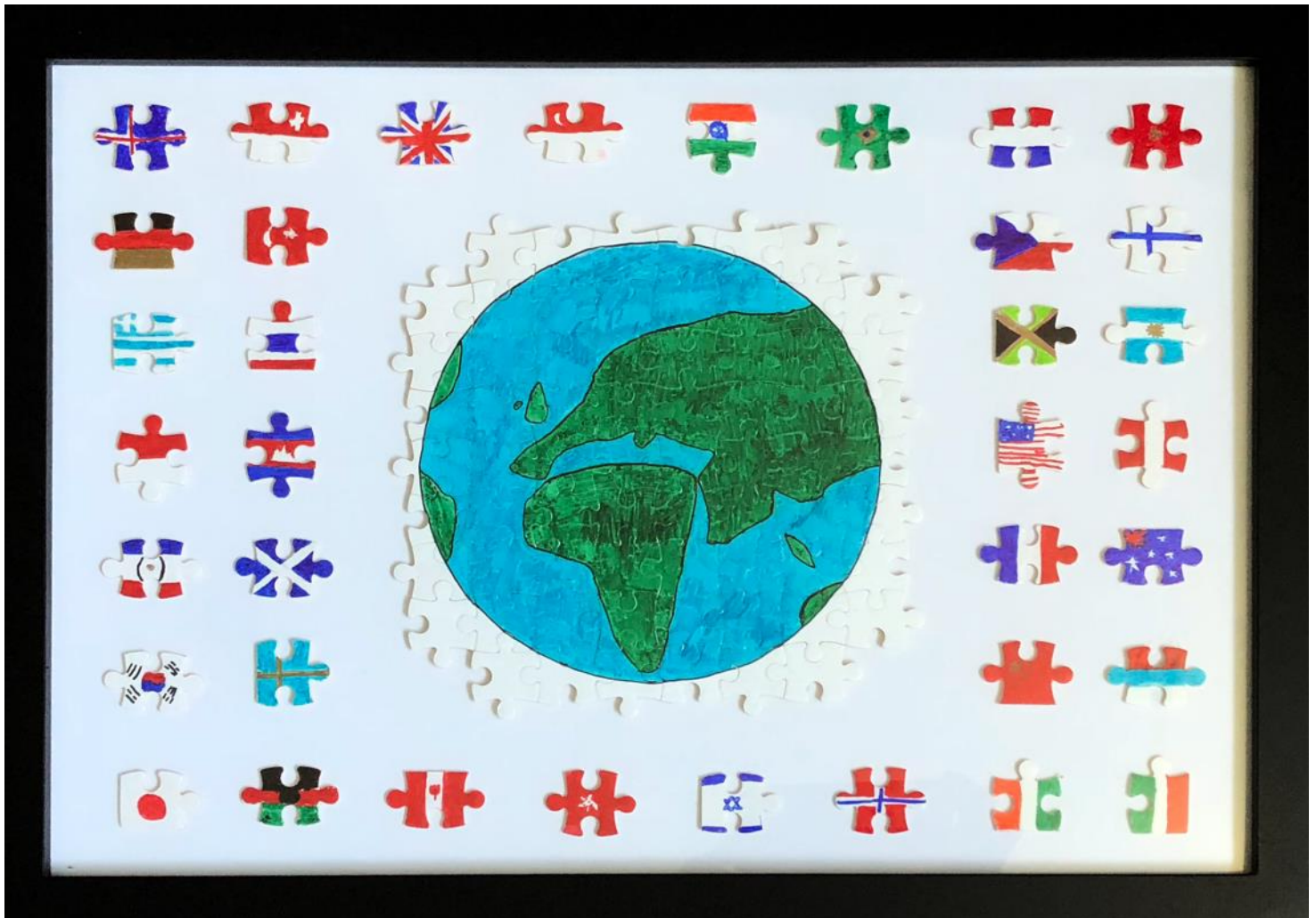
Year 3 Macaws

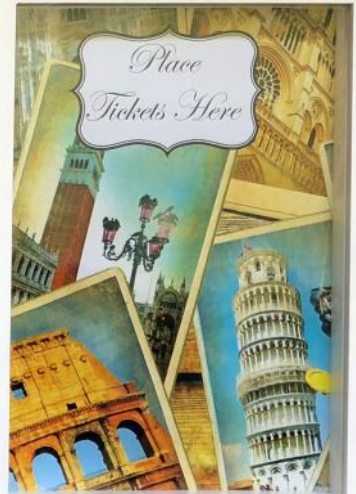
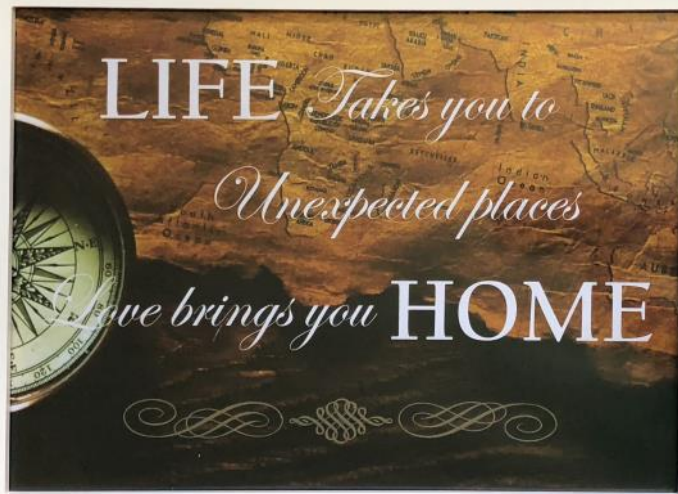
Year 3 Toucans 'Captivating Cultures'
