Literacy

Next week in Literacy, we will be starting our new unit of work titled 'Stories with Familiar Settings.' Throughout the week, we will be making puppets, re-telling the story using our story telling skills, sequencing the story to show our understanding of the events as well as describing different characters using adventurous adjectives.

Phonics

Phonics groups start this week. Children will have five phonics lessons per week. This week, the children will review and consolidate their learning. This is an important step to make sure that we group the children to best fit their learning needs.

Maths

We will continue our unit of work about shapes, moving on to look at 3D shapes. We are going to learn the names of 3D shapes, as well as some of their properties. When we have described our shapes accurately, we are going to sort and solve problems relating to 3D shapes. The children will take part in fun, practical activities using a variety of resources in and outside of the classroom. We will concentrate on saying the names of the shapes and recognizing them in pictures, around the classroom and at home.

Themed Learning - Who Am I?

Our Themed Learning topic this term is called 'Who Am I?' We will be putting the finishing touches to our autobiographies. We will continue to look at countries from around the world, focusing on famous landmarks such as The Great Wall of China, The Eiffel Tower and Buckingham Palace. In Art, we will develop our observation skills by looking closely at facial features. The children will continue to create self-portraits in the style of Pablo Picasso using interesting shapes, lines, colours and patterns.

Computer Science

In Year 1, we are teaching the students how to log on to the school computer system independently. They will be learning how navigate the key board with increased speed and accuracy. The program we will be working with this week is called 'Typing with Tizzy.'
