Deadline for schools to submit entries is 25 March 2015.

Competition rules and judging criteria

1. Entries must be submitted by schools to the Global Classroom team by Wednesday 25 March 2015. Entries should be submitted electronically and emailed to global.classroom@nordanglia.com.

2. Each school can submit a maximum of 5 entries for each age category - Primary (Y4-6), Lower Secondary (Y7-9) and Upper Secondary (Y10-13).

3. Entries must be 500 words (+/-10%). Entries which exceed or do not meet the word limit will not be judged.

4. Entries should be a single student's work.



- You have been asked to write between 450 and 550 words on the topic of 'Somewhere Unforgettable". There are lots more examples and ideas to inspire you on the Global Classroom
- We are running a House competition to select the best stories from our school
- Stories must be handed in to Mr Robinson typed but on paper with your full name(s) and class by Monday 2nd March. One entry per student. It must be all your own work.
- Mr Cooklin and others will select the winning stories from our school and award house points
- These can then be redrafted and sent onto the Nord Anglia competition (5 only) where the overall winners are then selected by Nord Anglia
