# Great Debates



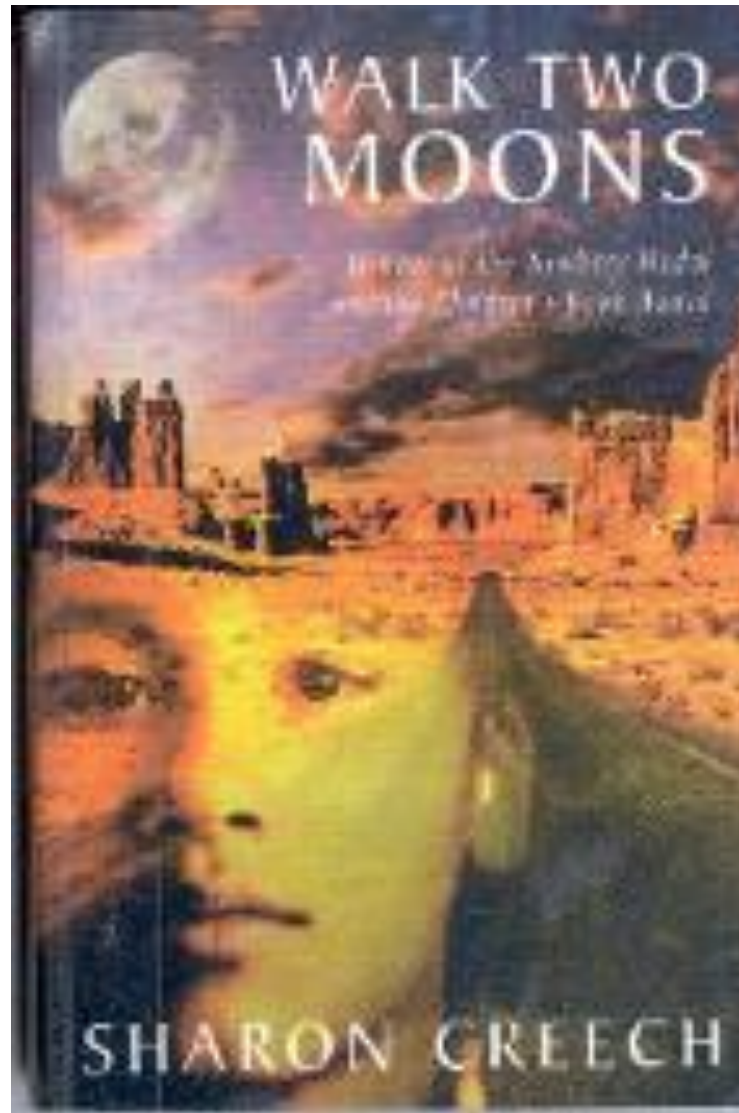
- These are open for everyone to vote and take part in

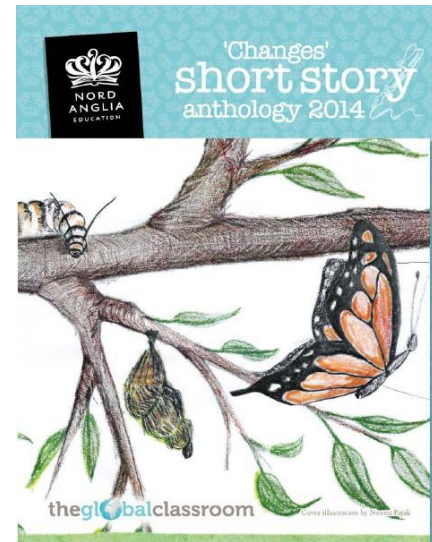

## Creative writing competition 2015



Do you love writing? Are you interested in being published? Then our creative writing competition is for you. Take a look at the information below to get you started.

### Somewhere unforgettable



This year's topic is 'somewhere unforgettable'.

Your entry should focus on a description of a place that happened there, or someone you met, but in creating a picture of your unforgettable place it can be real or fictional, it can be somewhere you've always wanted to go.

### How to enter

Competition launches **5 January 2015**.

Check details of how to enter with your school. Each school can submit up to **five entries for each age group**: primary (Year 4-6), lower secondary (Year 7-9) and upper secondary (Year 10+).

Deadline for schools to submit entries is **25 March 2015**.

### Competition rules and judging criteria

1. Entries must be submitted by schools to the Global Classroom team by Wednesday 25 March 2015. Entries should be submitted electronically and emailed to [global.classroom@nordanglia.com](mailto:global.classroom@nordanglia.com).
2. Each school can submit a maximum of 5 entries for each age category - Primary (Y4-6), Lower Secondary (Y7-9) and Upper Secondary (Y10-13).
3. Entries must be 500 words (+/-10%). Entries which exceed or do not meet the word limit will not be judged.
4. Entries should be a single student's work.

# Creative writing competition 2015



- You have been asked to write between **450 and 550 words** on the topic of **‘Somewhere Unforgettable’**. There are lots more examples and ideas to inspire you on the Global Classroom
- We are running a House competition to select the best stories from our school
- Stories must be handed in to Mr Robinson typed but on paper with your full name(s) and class by **Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> March**. One entry per student. It must be all your own work.
- Mr Cooklin and others will select the winning stories from our school and award house points
- These can then be redrafted and sent onto the Nord Anglia competition (5 only) where the overall winners are then selected by Nord Anglia

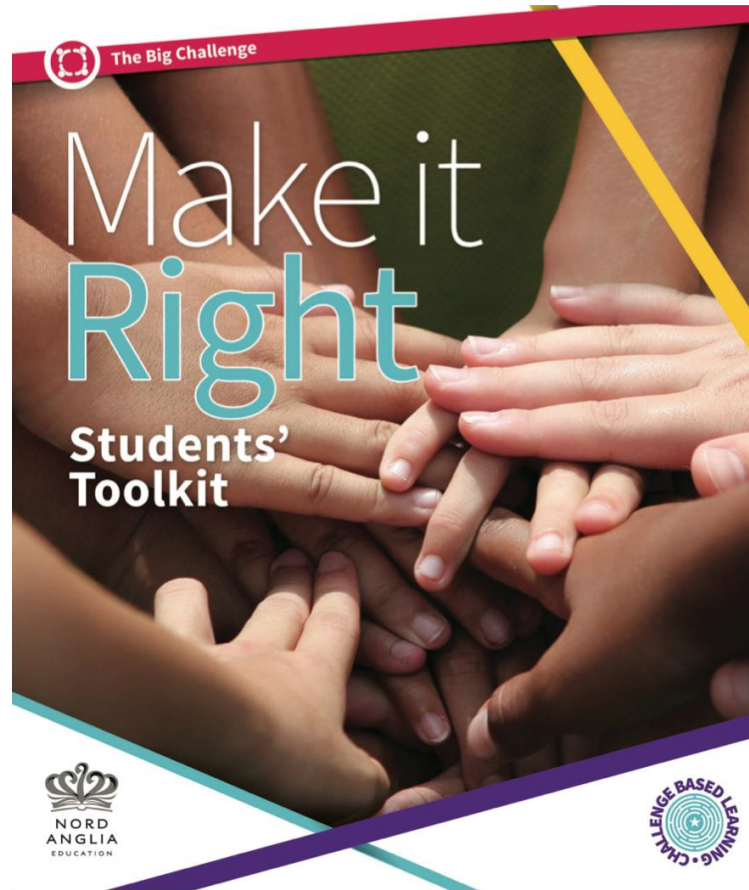
