A Look at Learning

“Pilot Programme” Monday 7th – Thursday 24th June



Whilst we await directions about the pilot programme from the authorities, we have been liaising with other schools who experienced the first pilot programme to find out more.

We will issue the details of dates, times and age groups as soon as we have been given them and you will receive your updated “Forward Together” booklet next week. In the meantime, some key points are:

- The pilot programme begins on Monday 7th June and ends on Thursday 24th June when the authorities will begin their review. Therefore, our final 4 days of the academic year will be delivered via our Virtual School Experience. The school year ends on Wednesday 30th June.
- Early Years classes (Nursery, foundation 1 and Foundation 2) are not part of the pilot programme.
- Parents, children and staff should expect that members of the Covid Taskforce will be on our campus throughout the pilot programme.
- When and the length of time the children can be on campus will be decided by the authorities, not us, for the pilot programme.
- Our staff will support the children to practise what is expected of them during the pilot programme. The children will need a large water bottle, full on arrival at school.
- All adults and children will be expected to wear masks at all times. Your child will need 2 masks and a bag to take home their dirty mask.
- There will be 1.5 metres social distancing in classrooms so children will have their own separate table and tray of equipment and learning materials.
- We should expect that children will not be allowed on campus every day during

the pilot programme as there will be scheduled days for deep cleaning. We should also expect the number of hours on campus will be limited and not full school days.

In your “[Forward Together Part 3](#)” booklet which was published earlier in the year, you can find the drop off and pick up arrangements described. The classroom protocols are also listed.

Of course, the pilot programme may well require some changes so we will send you an updated booklet next week. For example, we do not yet know if we will be allowed to include snacks and playtimes.

However, in the meantime, please do refer to the booklet. In the FAQ section at the end, it explains what will happen if there is a Covid positive case.

Global Campus World Tour




As you know, NAS children regularly engage with other Nord Anglia schools and students around the world via the Global Campus platform. This term, the Global Campus World Tour is taking place.


Asia including India, Vietnam, Hong Kong, China and ... Indonesia.
