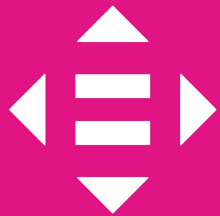

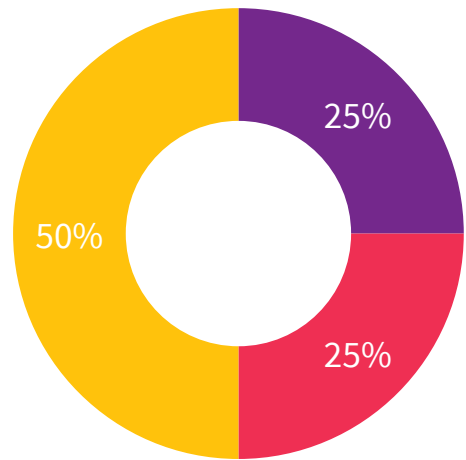

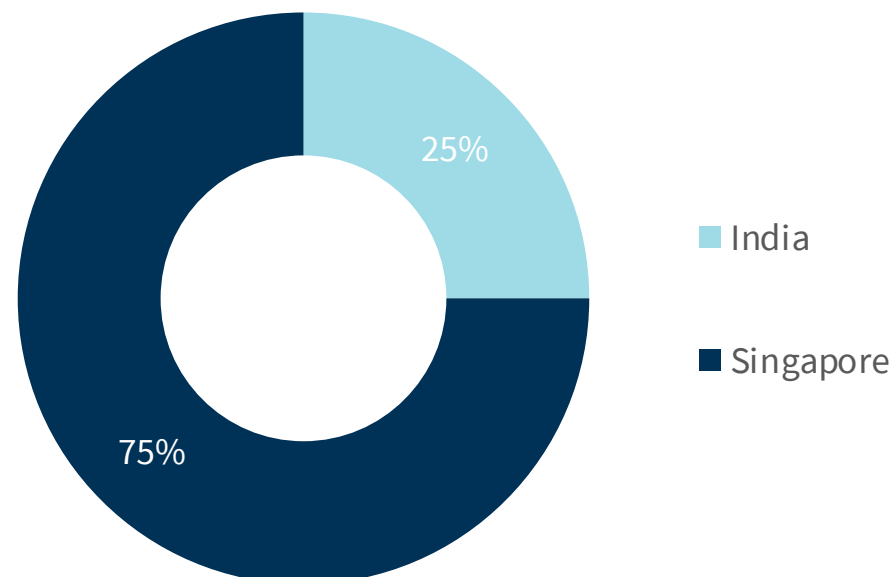


Fundraising: an event whose primary purpose is to raise money for a community partner

Singapore Red Cross Society

The work of the Red Cross in Singapore began on 30 September 1949 as a branch of the British Red Cross. On 6 April 1973, it was incorporated by an Act of Parliament and became known as the Singapore Red Cross (SRC).

Their vast network of donors, volunteers, employees and partners contribute to their lifesaving mission by serving in the following services and programmes:

- Community First Aid, Transport Aid, Food Aid, Elder Aid Red Cross Home for the Disabled, Blood Donor Recruitment Programme, Singapore Red Cross Academy, Civil Emergency Response & International Disaster Relief

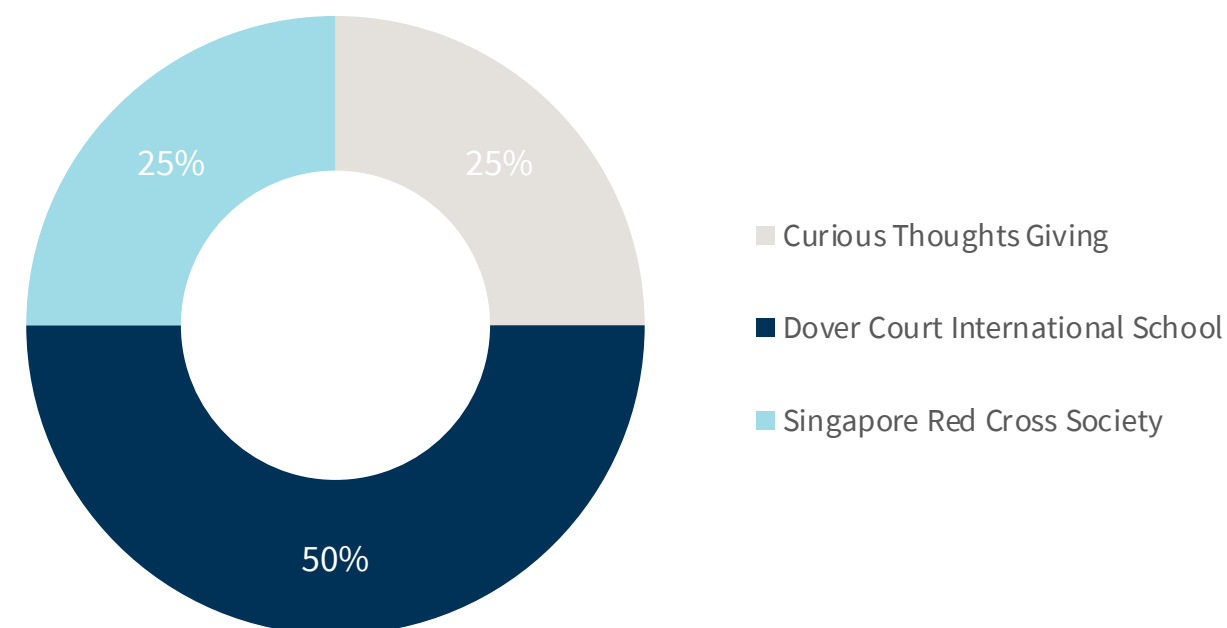
Star Shelter

In March 1999, Star Shelter opened its doors. It is a registered charity with IPC Status and is the only secular crisis centre in Singapore.

Star Shelter aims to provide a safe temporary refuge for women and their children who are victims of family violence regardless of race, language, creed or religion. They also empower the victims to manage and take responsibility for their lives and assist them in rebuilding their lives free from violence.

Curious Thoughts Giving

Curious Thoughts Giving help less privileged students and the elderly through education and activities targeted at recreation and social belonging, and physical and mental health. CTG provide free structured Literacy or MOE English programmes for children who are living in shelters or are beneficiaries of a Voluntary Welfare Organisation (VWO). They also organise a community initiative that brings volunteers from the public (children and families) to read to the less privileged elderly from Senior Activity Centres.



Autism Awareness Day

April 2021

In April we acknowledged Autism Awareness Day. Our students attended a virtual whole school assembly aimed at helping to improve their understanding and more importantly, acceptance of autism and neurodiversity. SmallTalk is a specialised programme which focuses on early literacy skills and supporting low-income parents with parenting strategies. These strategies are designed to help enhance the child's home learning environment and improve the overall learning outcomes of disadvantaged children.

Students across both the Primary and Secondary contributed with generous donations. Year 6 students then helped sort and pack all items, including bags, water bottles, books, stationery and educational materials that the children and families can use at home.

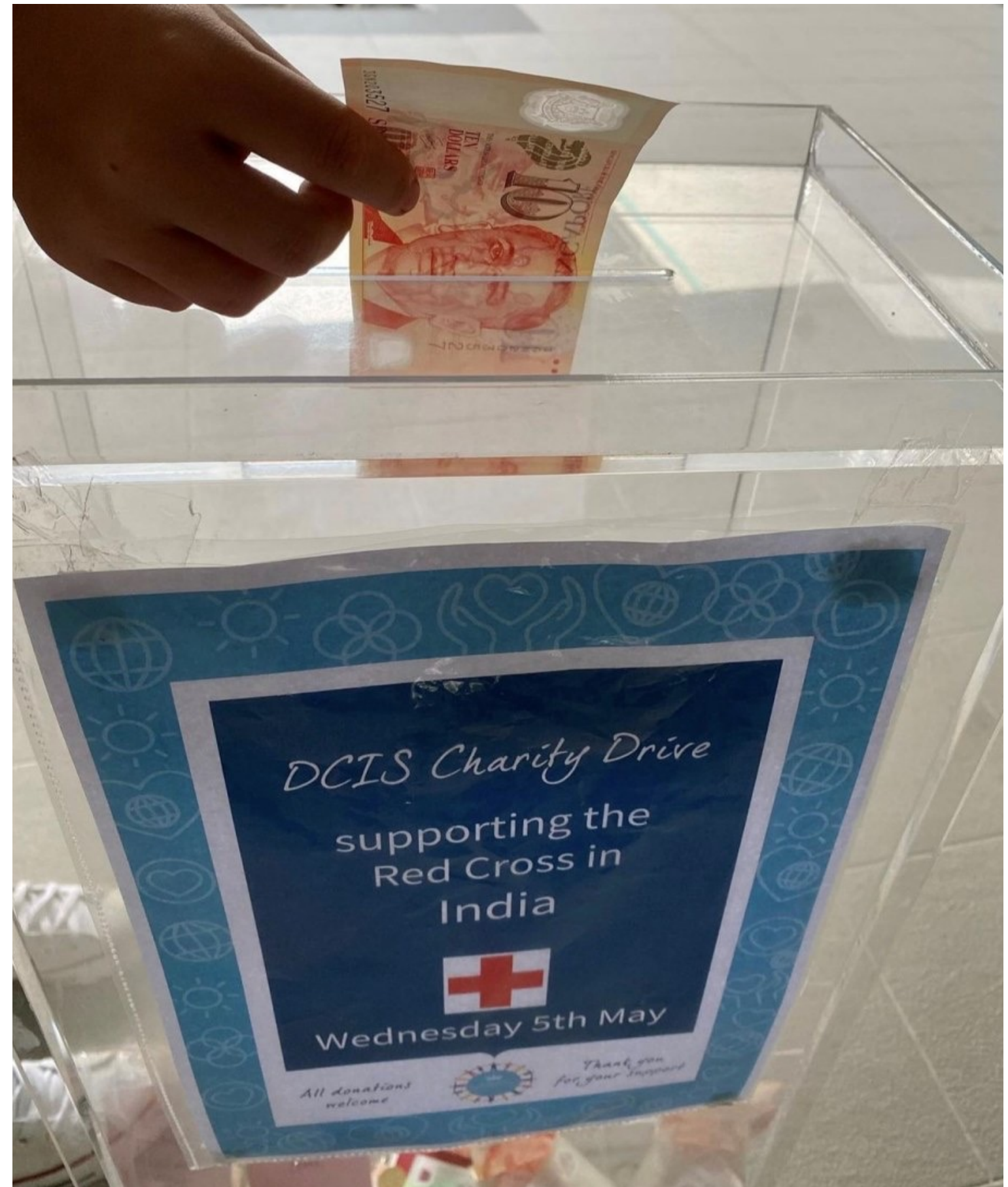


India Relief Fundraising

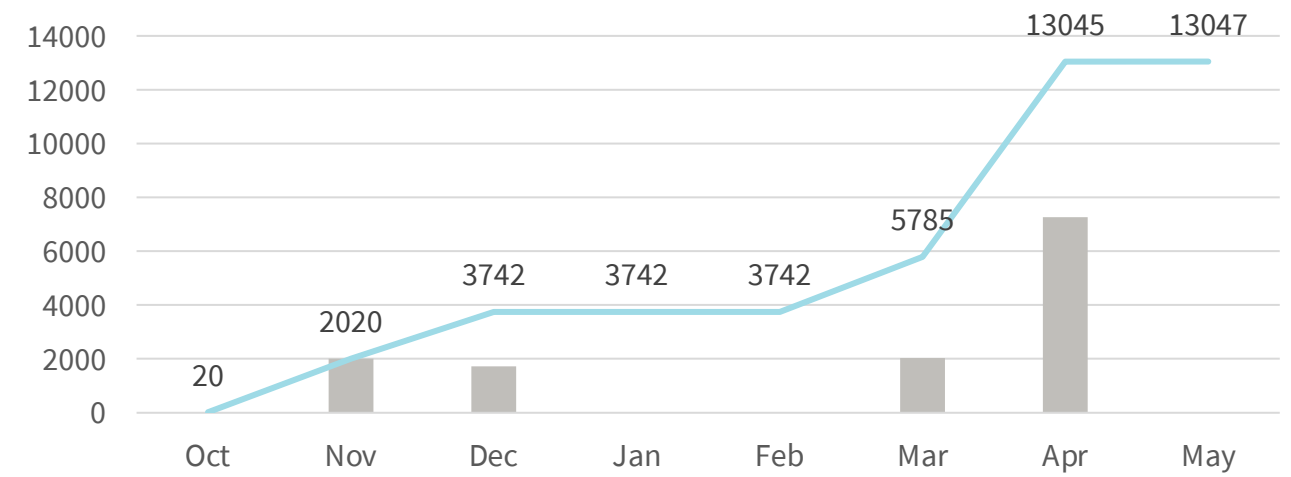

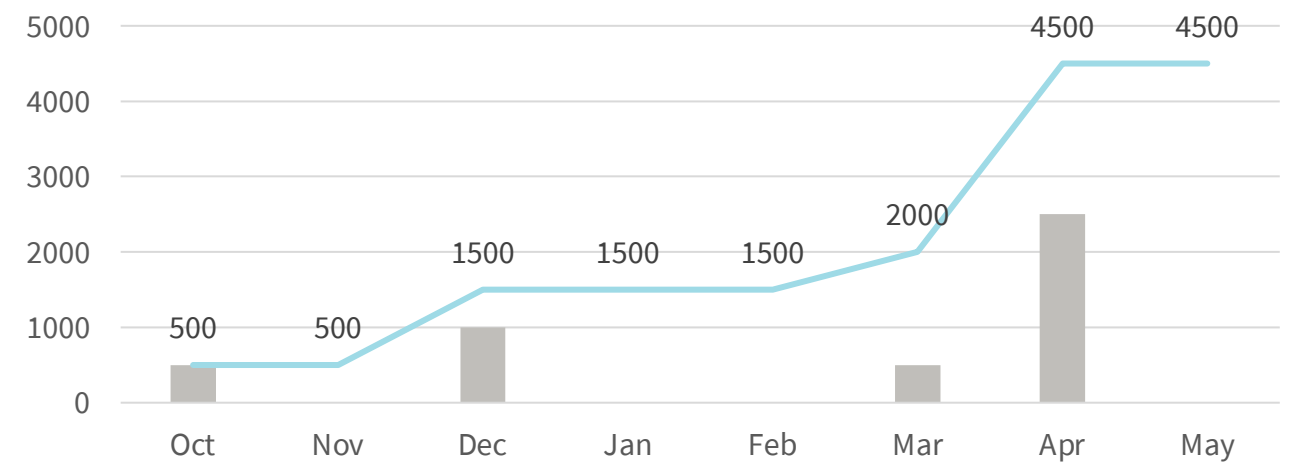
