Brilliant Bazaar!





We have had a busy term in the music department. The last half term was especially enjoyable for the children as they worked on their musical pieces to present at the recent concerts. A particular aspect of the concert that may not have been obvious was that the construction of each performance was heavily influenced by the children themselves. Children were given the opportunity and encouraged to voice their ideas on how they could present the respective piece. Student input came in the form of; the creation of certain actions, selection of instruments to include, extra vocal parts, movement, dancing and expression. When children are given the chance to contribute to the design of an activity, they tend to enjoy it even more. In music class and rehearsals, they were guided and supported right up until the last week when they demonstrated that they did not need Mr. Brent to conduct them at the front but could perform the song all on their own. The class teachers did a wonderful job of helping the students create their costumes.

Another feature this term has been developing student curiosity for learning instruments. At every opportunity, children are given access to the growing range of instruments in the music department and in this way we hope to foster more specific musical interests. PTC Letters and appointment slips will be sent out on 9 January and PTC meetings will take place Wednesday 29 January and Thursday 30 January 2020.
