Construction progress in Dhading



Over the weekend of 16th & 17th February, staff from The British School returned to Dhading and visited the three schools that TBS Charities is rebuilding. We are pleased to report that the building work is progressing on schedule and expected date of completion is early May. It is not long now until students will return to permanent classrooms one again

Construction at Gayetri Devi Primary School is the furthest ahead, with the ground floor completed and work starting on the second storey. The community at Gayetri are incredibly impressed with our building work. With a few minor alterations that they have suggested, we were able to incorporate an area for a library into the new building. As their previous library room was destroyed by the earthquake, they can soon get back to reading in a safe and secure room. Land at Shree Rudrakanya primary school's current location is in short supply, even with local landowners being as accommodating as possible. The decision was thus made to purchase land at a new location 300 meters down the road, an area much better suited to the needs of the school. It is both bigger and more accessible for the students, and when construction is finished and they move to the new site, the students will not only have new buildings but the play area for the children will be more than doubled.

Staff and Sixth form students are travelling to Dhading in mid February for TBS expedition week. The aim of this week is for students to link their learning to real life situations and allow them to lead the way in creating positive change. We have been contacted by several schools who want our help but have been waiting for guidance from the Ministry of Education before we commit further resources. With 587 out of 608 schools in Dhading having unsafe classrooms, we are looking to ensure that the money that we have raised will be spent in communities where it will have the most impact.
