Reading

Pupils will be taught to:

- Name, read and write Phase 2, 3 and 5 sounds
- Apply Phonic knowledge to decode unknown words
- Read common exceptions words
- Re-read books to build up fluency and confidence in word reading
- Listen to and discuss a wide range of poems, stories and non-fiction texts

Year 1

Number and Place Value

Pupils will be taught to:

- Count forwards and backwards up to 100.
- Count, read and write numbers up to 100.
- Identify one more/one less than any number up to 100.
- Represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations.
- Read and write numbers up to 20 in words.

Fractions

Pupils will be taught to:

- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

Geometry

Pupils will be taught to:

Recognise and name common 2D shapes including; rectangles (and squares), circles and triangles.

Year 1 Curriculum Overview



Buildings



Learning is opened through an entry point to engage pupils and assess their current understanding. An introduction to Buildings.
Children will take a photo out of their window and talk about all the different buildings they can see.
We will go on a Virtual tour, using Google Earth, of the area surrounding BIS.

Algorithms

 Students will develop an understanding of how to create a series of instructions can control a robot.
