Chocolate



Learning is opened through an entry point to engage pupils and assess their current understanding.

The introduction to chocolate will be a 'chocolate tasting' afternoon. Children can bring in any chocolate that they sourced over the half term holiday, there will be a variety of chocolate provided for tasting.

Children should describe each chocolate using their 5 senses in a rotation activity.

Knowledge Harvest - What would you expect to see if you went to a chocolate factory? Children reflect on how they think chocolate is made and how it reaches the shops and their homes. Complete KWL grid.



At the end of each unit, outcomes are celebrated an exit point

Children will design and create chocolate bars, which will be sold in school to raise money for our charity partners.

Speaking, Listening & Drama Opportunities

Students will prepare a spoken book review.

They will be taught to:

- Listen and respond appropriately to adults and peers
- Ask relevant questions to extend their understanding and knowledge of the topic
- Articulate and justify answers, arguments and opinions
- Participate in drama and role play to explore characters.
