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# Purpose of this meeting.

- To give you an insight in to all the Milepost has to offer
- To highlight other important information for all Milepost 1 parents



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### Transition

- Term 1 Child initiated learning and adult - focused groups throughout the week. Working on outstanding Early Learning Goals.
- Term 2 Child initiated learning, adult focus groups and some whole class teaching. Move to National curriculum.
- Term 3 More whole class teaching to ensure a smooth transition into Year 2.



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### Learning in Year 1

- Emphasis on children becoming independent learners, developed over the three terms
- Early focus on play-based activities, carousel and focussed group work
- Range of learning experiences offered to develop skills and apply knowledge
- Balance of play based, independent, teacher focussed and whole class learning activities
  - Learning Assistant available for support



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### Learning in Year 2

- Less play based learning
- Stronger emphasis on children's independence and application of skills
- Develop and extend knowledge and skills taught in Year 1
- Greater focus on whole class learning activities
- Learning Assistant available for support



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### English

National Curriculum for England and Wales

- Includes phonics, spelling, handwriting, reading, writing, speaking and listening
- Many interactive, play-based and role-play activities that are linked across the curriculum
- Reading books will be changed twice a week and Reading diaries must be signed
- Weekly Homework
- Library One visit per week (after school access with parents)



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### Phonics

- Follow Letters and Sounds and use some resources from Read Write inc
- Phonics is set up in Phases
- Phases 2 to 6
- Stream dependent on which Phase your child is working in
- Key to your child's reading and writing
- learning the letter sounds and being able to segment and blend
- Regularly assess progress in phonics throughout the year



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### Maths

#### National Curriculum for England and Wales

- Curriculum includes: counting, calculating, recalling number facts, measuring, understanding shape, handling data and problem solving
- Abacus Maths Curriculum developed using the National Curriculum
- Rm Easimaths Online child driven intuitive math's resource
- Activities are fun, interactive, hands on and are linked across the curriculum
  - Homework allocated weekly
- Many learning aids, such as number lines and counting materials are available for support

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### Homework

- Reading Read for up to 20 minutes every day. Reading books will be changed twice a week, on a Thursday and a Sunday reading diaries must be signed.
- Maths Abacus, Rm Easimaths, or other paper based tasks where appropriate
- English Phonics, Spelling, Writing Task
- IPC when appropriate (often research and practical tasks)

Any additional homework tasks will be identified in the Weekly Learning Letter



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### Online Learning Resources

- Abacus Maths Tasks linked directly to learning in class
- RM Easimaths Online child driven intuitive Math's resource completed at home
- Purlpe Mash A host of online tools to develop classroom learning
- Education City Many interactive resources in areas from Phonics to Science
- All the above are to enhance your child's learning
- You will receive logins soon in your child's 'Learning Diary'



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### Physical Education

- Children can come to school in their PE clothes on designated PE days
- PE Kit: Compass t-shirt and shorts and suitable trainers
- Children must have a water bottle
- If the lesson is outside they must have a hat



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### Swimming

- Swimming is a compulsory part of the Compass curriculum
- Once per week
- Students wear normal school uniform and bring their swimming kit to school
- They can wear their swim suit under their clothes if it is the first lesson of the day
- Swimming kit swim clothes, flip flops/crocs, swimming cap and a towel
- Children change in the changing rooms provided, independence is encouraged.



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### Uniform

- New design phased in over the next 12 months
- Formal blue shirts with collar
- Grey trousers, shorts, skirt
- Formal flat black shoes only
- Book bag, cap, backpack, PE/Swim Bag
- Uniform is compulsory No other casual clothes should be worn for school.
- No jewelry apart from stud earrings/watch
