

Dear Parents

This letter has been sent home to inform you about your child's learning for **next week**.

In *Literacy*, we are learning to compose our own stories based on the wordless text 'Flotsam'. We are looking at planning then composing a fictional text using the grammar features we have been looking at this term.

In *Numeracy*, we will be using our multiplication and division skills to identify common factors and common multiples. We will also be testing number facts relating to prime numbers before explaining how they work. Finally, we will be recapping short division using the bus stop method.

In *Science*, we will be starting our new topic of reversible and irreversible changes. We will be identifying the differences between the two, and investigating how to separate various mixed materials.

In IPC, we will be continuing our learning about the Crystal Palace exhibition of 1851. We will be researching the history of previous inventions, before creating our own class exhibition.

In ICT, we are learning to digitally manipulate images to create layered images linking to our focused book 'Flotsam'.

In **PSHE**, we are learning what some people in my class like about us and to accept their praise. We are looking at our achievements over this topic and celebrating them.

For *Spellings*, students will receive their spelling lists on Thursday and will be tested on the list the following Thursday. Students will have 11 words to learn during the course of the week.
