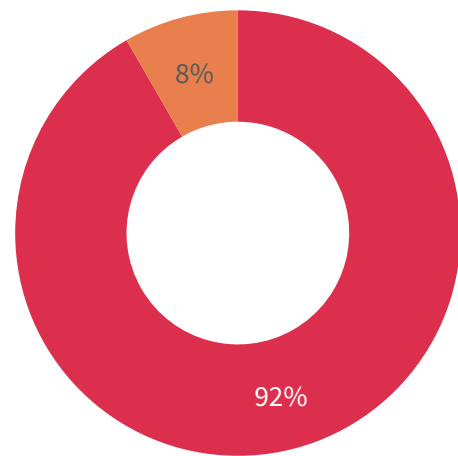

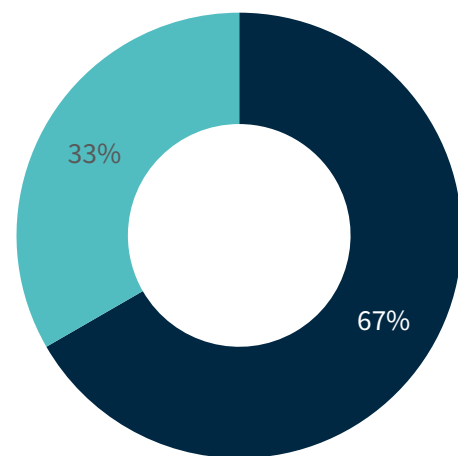
## Type of activity

## Rabbit School

Rabbit School was established in May 1997. Its mission is oriented toward the rehabilitation and full integration of people with intellectual disabilities into Cambodian society. It promotes the rights of children with intellectual disabilities and believe that they have the same fundamental rights as their fellow citizens to a decent life with equal dignity and access to education. Its program includes readiness classes , integrated and inclusive education, pre-vocational and vocational training and job placement.

## World Vision

World Vision in Cambodia helps improve livelihood of poor and vulnerable households, reduce

malnutrition of children under five years living in urban slums of Phnom Penh, improve the quality of education of school children up to grade 6 or higher and promote self-learning at home.

## Seeway Tanzania

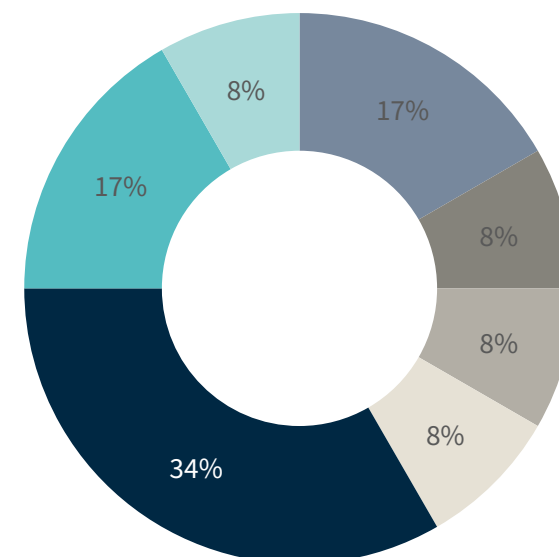
Seeway Tanzania (SWTz) provides a home, school and full-rounded support to orphaned and vulnerable children in Imbaseni village, Maji ya Chai Ward, close to Arusha in northern Tanzania.

## Smile Cambodia

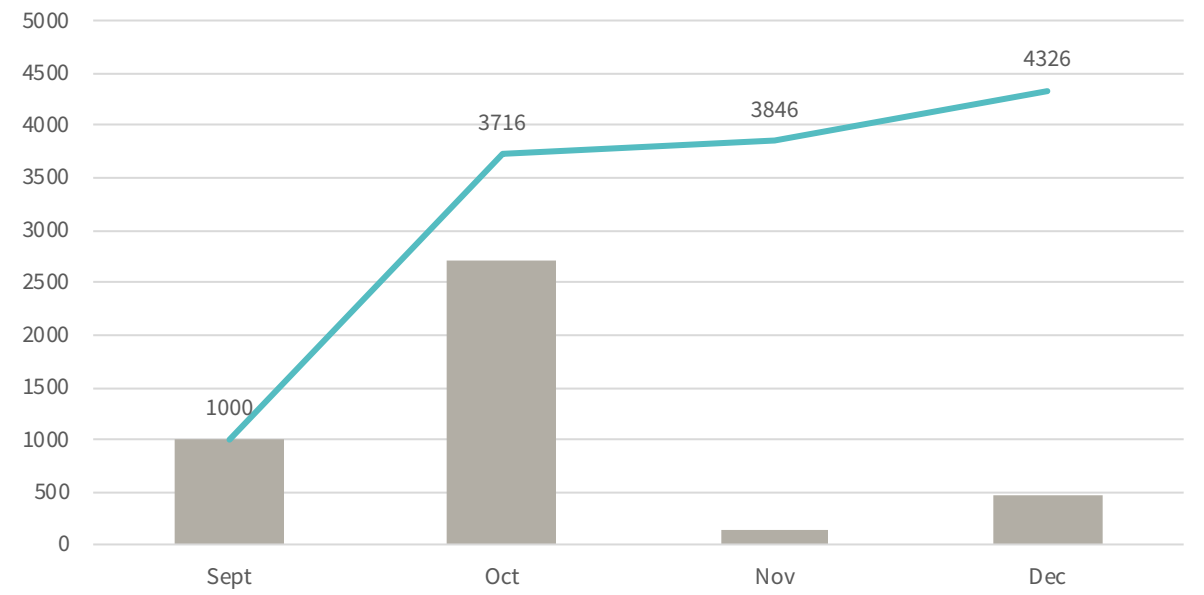
