Music is such an important part of our lives and we only need look at how the children grow and learn as they enjoy musical experiences to see the evidence. When singing or playing music there is lot of work occurring across the neural pathways within the brain translating thoughts into action. Music participation is mental gymnastics for the mind and helps to increase cognitive function which positively impacts other areas of learning such as language learning and memory capabilities.





And our students across the school are really enjoying music with our new music teacher Mr. Brent. The diversity of experiences they have had during this first half term, include: Voice training and healthy singing practice;, exploration of a wide range of instruments; recognising and writing music rhythmically and melodically; using expression, movement and drama with music; learning about and listening to classical composers; cooperating with others and building up a repertoire songs from around the world, especially those participating in Choir. A highlight was the Big Sing event at AIS where approximately thirty students from NAS represented the school in a celebration of singing and took part in choral workshops.
