Key information about the 'Tic Tac Toe' system

Aims

- To develop independent learners
- To encourage students to manage their time effectively
- To enable students to be resourceful

How does Tic Tac Toe work?

- Students choose three tasks to complete over the term in each subject
- The tasks should form a line that runs through the centre. The line can be vertical, horizontal or diagonal.
- Each pupil should complete a task labelled as 1, 2 and 3
- For each task that is chosen there is a due date
- In some cases this is denoted by 'w/c' which means week commencing. Students should then submit the work in their lesson that week.

How long should students spend?

- Students should spend around 60 minutes on each task in Year 7/8.
- Students are encouraged to break up the tasks into research, producing and proof reading.

<p>1. LO: To be able to use an atlas to locate the 10 longest rivers in the world.</p> <p><i>Task: Create a map identifying key geographical features. Produce a map with the 10 longest rivers in the world clearly marked. (Print a blank world map and draw them on).</i></p> <p>Due date: 8I: 05/10/2017</p> <p>Top Tip: Remember that all maps and diagrams must have; a title, key, clear labels and high quality presentation.</p> <p>Mrs Eades-Laird has blank maps if you need one, or you can find your own on google. Research where the longest rivers are and draw them onto your map.</p>	<p>1. LO: To be able to recall and explain the key features of the water cycle.</p> <p><i>Task: Create a cartoon strip of the water cycle. Create a cartoon strip from the perspective of a raindrop to describe the journey taken during the water cycle. "The Journey of Mr Drop".</i></p> <p>Due date: 8I: 05/10/2017</p> <p>Top Tip: Think about the key processes and how you might want to display/explain these within your work.</p> <p>It must have images and words please!</p>	<p>2. LO: To explain how rivers erode the landscape around them.</p> <p><i>Task: Explain the processes of river erosion. Create a power point presentation or a poster on the different processes of erosion.</i></p> <p>Due date: 8I: 16/11/17</p> <p>Top Tip: Make sure there is lots of detail not just pictures! Think about how you could use explanations, diagrams and images to help you explain erosion.</p>
<p>1. LO: To be able to display your understanding of how a <u>river delta</u> forms.</p> <p><i>Task: Use animation to explain the formation of a river delta. Using stop animation video / sequenced diagrams produce a video of how a delta forms and changes over time.</i></p> <p>Due date: 8I: 05/10/2017</p> <p>Top Tip: You could use a flip book, create models out of plasticine, create snapshots or use computer animation.</p> <p>You need a piece of written work that will help to explain your animation.</p>	<p>3. LO: To be able to explain how we could protect a population living on an area of coastline at risk from erosion.</p> <p>Task: Create a report on Coastal Erosion emergency procedures. Research and produce a report suggesting what a town could do to prevent coastal erosion.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Include at least four strategies. • Discuss how it will benefit the town. • Include a conclusion to summarise the benefits of protecting the town. <p>Due date: 8I: 14/12/2017</p> <p>Top Tip: How can you make sure all viewpoints are accounted for in your report? This will be supported with a task sheet closer to the time.</p>	<p>2. LO: To be able to describe the features found within a drainage basin.</p> <p><i>Task: Create a diagram to illustrate the key features of a drainage basin. Using images and internet sources, create a diagram showing the features found within a river system.</i></p> <p>E.g: Source Waterfall Meander Tributary Watershed V-shaped valley</p> <p>Due date: 8I: 16/11/17</p> <p>Top Tip: This diagram must have images and labels. Can be drawn on a piece of paper or it can be a 3D diagram.</p>
<p>1. LO: To explain how we can mitigate flooding.</p> <p><i>Task: Write a letter on flooding <u>prevention</u>. Write a letter to the local government to explain at least three ideas to protect a local town/area. Include research information and explanations how each works. (Barriers, dams, town planning, vegetation, education)</i></p> <p>Due date: 8I: 05/10/2017</p> <p>Top Tip: Research what other places have done to combat the problem and include this research as an appendix to go with your letter.</p> <p><u>Prevention</u> means to stop something happening.</p>	<p>2. Add clear labels to explain the changes. No bigger than A4 size.</i></p> <p>Due date: W/C 11/09/17</p> <p>Top Tip: Make sure your graphs use a consistent scale and are easy to read. You may want to do them on the computer.</p>	<p>1. LO: To be able to analyse sources of information.</p> <p><i>Task: Collect three sources which could help to answer the question, 'What was life like in the Industrial Revolution?' Write an analysis of each source, using NOP (nature, origin, purpose)</i></p> <p>Due date: W/C 11/09/17</p> <p>Top Tip: Use the acronym in your exercise book to help you analyse sources.</p>	<p>2. LO: To be able to communicate about the past.</p> <p><i>Task: Imagine you are a factory worker during the Industrial Revolution in England. Write a diary entry about a typical work day. Include information about what you did, but also how it made you feel.</i></p> <p>Due date: W/C 09/10/17</p> <p>Top Tip: Think carefully about your character – how can this help you explain your typical day?</p>
<p>1. LO: To be able to carry out independent historical research.</p> <p><i>Task: Create a powerpoint presentation about the Industrial Revolution in the USA. What were the similarities and differences between that and the Industrial Revolution in England?</i></p> <p>Due date: W/C 11/09/17</p> <p>Top Tip: Focus your research on a few key topics, eg When did it start? What were the causes and consequences?</p>	<p>3. LO: To be able to consolidate information learned.</p> <p><i>Task: Create a revision booklet/leaflet for the topic 'The Industrial Revolution' using the notes in your exercise books and additional research. You must have a section for each LO covered.</i></p> <p>Due date: W/C 20/11/17</p> <p>Top Tip: Don't fill your leaflet with too much information – use bullet points, pictures and diagrams to summarise learning. Additional notes about core subjects

MATHEMATICS

- Students in Key Stage 3 will be set two pieces of homework per week.
- One piece will be set from *MyiMaths*, an online portal for which the students have personalised logins. These pieces will be marked online and their results logged. The tasks can be done several times for more practice, as the tasks change each time.
- The second piece of homework will be written, and should take between 30 and 45 minutes. It will be marked by the teacher or by peers in class.

ENGLISH

- Students in Key stage 3 will be set two pieces of homework per week.
- One piece will be set in direct relation to the classwork, and should take a minimum of forty minutes.
- The other piece will be shorter and relate to key skills such as spelling, punctuation and grammar: for example, revising for a spelling test, correcting punctuation in a text etc.
