Our subjects in the Spotlight this week are.... Mandarin and French

Year 7: In Mandarin, the students are focusing on Listening and Reading skills with the target vocabulary and sentence structures while working on the YCT mock papers accordingly, with various reading and writing activities to ensure students understand the topics. Year 7 have enthusiastically approached French this year, going from studying the basics of the language to now being able to express their thoughts and opinions. Having recently completed study on the topic of 'School', they are now moving onto describing where they live.

Year 8: In Mandarin, the students are focusing on Listening and Reading skills with the target vocabulary and sentence structures while working on the YCT mock papers accordingly, with various reading and writing activities to ensure students understand the topics. In French, Year 8 have recently benefited from studying a variety of grammatical elements. They are gaining confidence in using three tenses in their written and spoken work. This is preparing them well for the iGCSE course.

Year 9: In Mandarin, the students are focusing on Listening and Reading skills with the target vocabulary and sentence structures while working on the YCT mock papers accordingly, with various reading and writing activities to ensure students understand the topics. For French Year 9 pupils have been particularly working on their written skills this term, developing their answers more fully and being able to elevate responses to GCSE level. The topic that they are currently studying is that of various modes of transport and speaking about holidays, both past and future.

Year 10: In Mandarin, the main focus is on the speaking component of iGCSE after covering the topic of 'Everyday Life' from Unit 3 they will be learning the topics 'Hobbies' and 'Foods' from Unit 4 & 5 in iChinese Textbook. In French, Year 10 have approached the iGCSE course with commitment and enthusiasm this year. They are working through the iGCSE topics and nurturing the skills they will need to master to succeed in this course. We are particularly impressed with their excellent use of target language in lessons, and their dedication to progressing further with this.

Year 11: In Mandarin, students are working on the revision of the iGCSE past papers in preparation for the upcoming examination. For French, Year 11 are focusing on their iGCSE speaking exam preparation and have been working hard on this. They are also completing revision and past papers for the other three skills that will be assessed during the summer examinations.
