A few reminders for you at the start of this new term:

1. <u>Birthdays</u> Families often want their child's class to share in birthday celebrations and we are happy to support this. Please follow the following procedure if you wish your child to bring anything to school to celebrate their birthday with their classmates:

- Please notify your child's teacher in advance that you would like your child to bring birthday cake to school for their class and agree the most appropriate day/time.
- Your child may bring their birthday cake to school themselves. Alternatively, please arrange with the teacher for the cake to be delivered to the school office.
- **Birthday cake only** (no snacks, party bags, gifts).
- As food cannot be shared due to Covid protocols, please provide individually wrapped pieces of cake, muffins or cookies.
- We respectfully ask you to try to use environmentally friendly packaging.
- The birthday cake must be **nut-free** please.
- Children with allergies will bring their

birthday cake home for their parents to check it is safe for consumption.

2. <u>Head lice</u> It is normal practice at NAS to do a quick check for head lice at the start of every term. We are re-introducing this practice now we are all back on campus full-time. If our staff suspect your child has head lice, you will be notified immediately to collect your child from school and take them for treatment.

Year 1



The Foundation 1 children have taken part in an exciting new activity, "Write Dance". When we turned on the music, the children danced and made circles with long pieces of crepe paper as well as using their body parts. "Write Dance" is about finding the rhythm and energy for the coordination required when learning to write.
