



Curriculum Synopsis

The curriculum of Islamic Studies for year three focus on verses of the Qur'an, and the messages of the Prophet Muhammad (Hadith). It aims to give pupils a clear, thorough understanding of Islamic teachings, moral behavior and Islamic etiquette. Furthermore, it aims to give pupils a clear, thorough understanding of Islamic teachings, moral behavior and Islamic etiquette, and its contribution to modern science.

Some of the influential personalities in Islamic history are studied, such as the life of Prophet Muhammad (PBUH), role models, values and ethics. Moreover, student's skills in Tajweed are developed through reading the Holy Qur'an.

The Islamic syllabus covers five main areas which are imparted to students in a continuous and a systematic way to support their understanding, enhance their reflective thinking.

For the second term the students will study the following topics:

- Surat Al-Qadr and Surat Al-Maun (Divine Revelation)
Its very important to know the laylat Al Qadr and the reward that Muslim can achieve in this blessed night.
- Prophet Yunus (The Islamic creed):
It is very important to teach our students more stories about Prophets. Prophet Yunus has a great story mentioned in Al-Quran and from this story our students will learn many lessons that they can use them in their daily life.
- My Prayers (Islamic ruling)
Students should know the purpose of salah. Salah provides a means to ask and thank Allah for blessings. Salah is to act as a person's communication with God.
- Dining Etiquette:
We will help our students to follow the sunnah by learning the dining etiquette and keep it as part of their daily life.
- Some of the Prophet's manners (The Prophet's biography):
Our students will learn the importance of following Prophet's sunnah and how this helps us as Muslim to be successful in both worlds.

Supporting at Home

The support at home aims to document the student's relationship with the Holy Quran as the first source of knowledge, behavior, values, taste and beauty in order to build a Quranic mentality and psychology, by continuing to read the Qur'an and considering the provisions of intonation (*tajweed*).

One of the key elements of this support is to implant the love of Prophet Muhammad "peace be upon him" in the heart of the student through the experience of the Prophet's biography, and to highlight the life of the Prophet (peace and blessings of Allah be upon him) as a good example and a role-model to follow.
