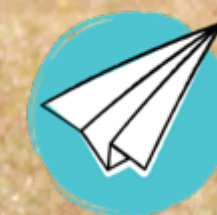

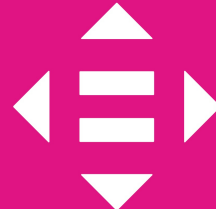

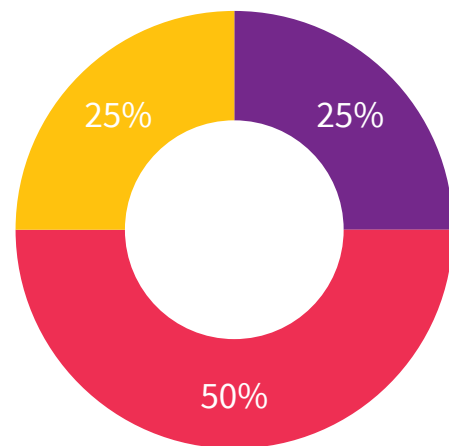

Type of activity

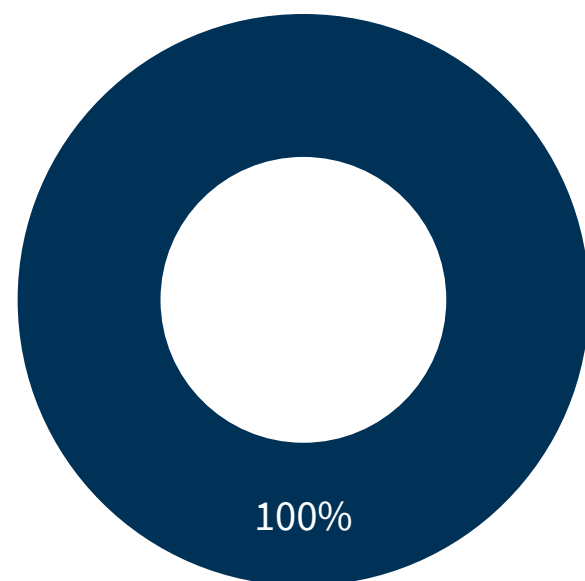


Fundraising: an event whose primary purpose is to raise money for a community partner

Make A Wish

The Singapore affiliate started this amazing journey in April 2002, and we've granted over 1,500 wishes. We have nine staff in our office and a pool of dedicated volunteers to help us grant wishes and raise funds for our mission. We are part of a global organisation which began in 1980 after a team of people granted the wish of a little boy called Chris in Arizona, whose dream was to be a policeman.

Chris had leukaemia, and he wanted very much to experience his dream. With the help of the local police, Chris wish was granted. He had an amazing day riding in a police helicopter, sworn in as an honorary patrolman, given a specially-made uniform, and a chance to show off his motorcycling skills.

The people involved in his wish were so moved by the experience that they pledged to continue to "share the power of a wish". Since the granting of Chris' wish, the Make-A-Wish Foundation International has been responsible for making the wishes of over 415,000 children come true.

Star Shelter

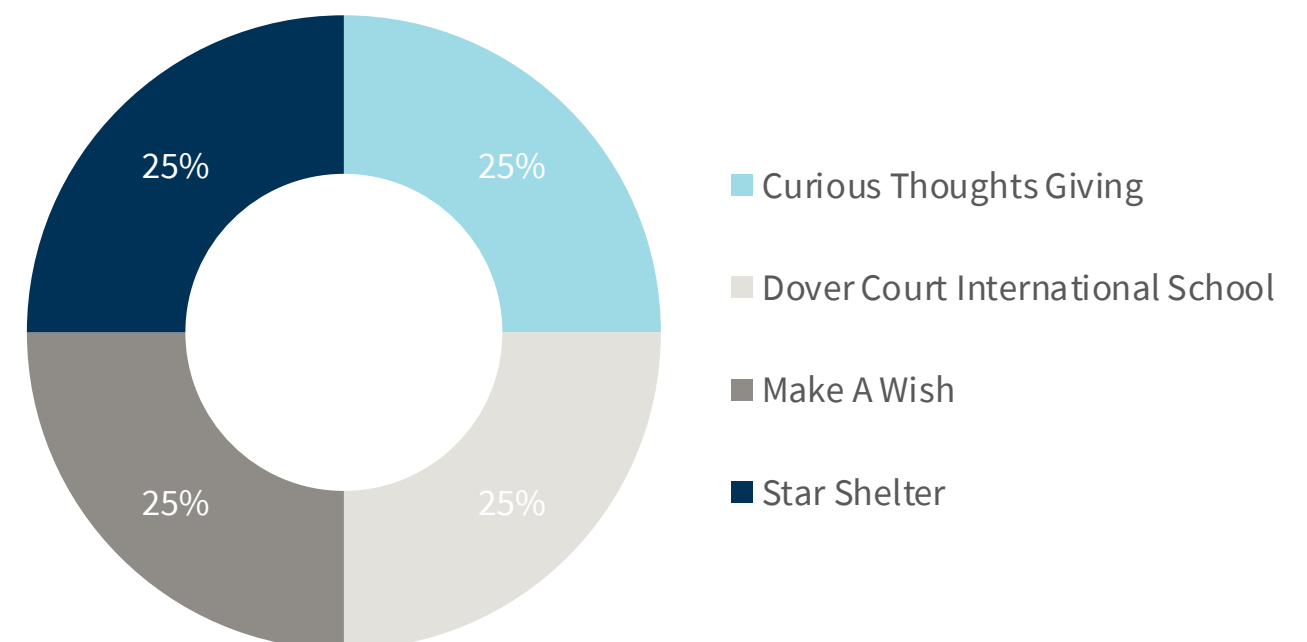
In March 1999, Star Shelter opened its doors. It is a registered charity with IPC Status, and is the only secular crisis centre in Singapore.

Star Shelter aims to provide a safe temporary refuge for women and their children who are victims of family violence regardless of race, language, creed or religion. They also empower the victims to manage and take responsibility

for their lives and assist them in rebuilding their lives free from violence.

Curious Thoughts Giving

Curious Thoughts Giving help less privileged students and the elderly through education and activities targeted at recreation and social belonging, and physical and mental health. CTG provide free structured Literacy or MOE English programmes for children who are living in shelters or are beneficiaries of a Voluntary Welfare Organisation (VWO). They also organise a community initiative that brings volunteers from the public (children and families) to read to the less privileged elderly from Senior Activity Centres.

As per tradition, last day of the term was a non-uniform fundraising day, where we raised money for Make-A-Wish Foundation.

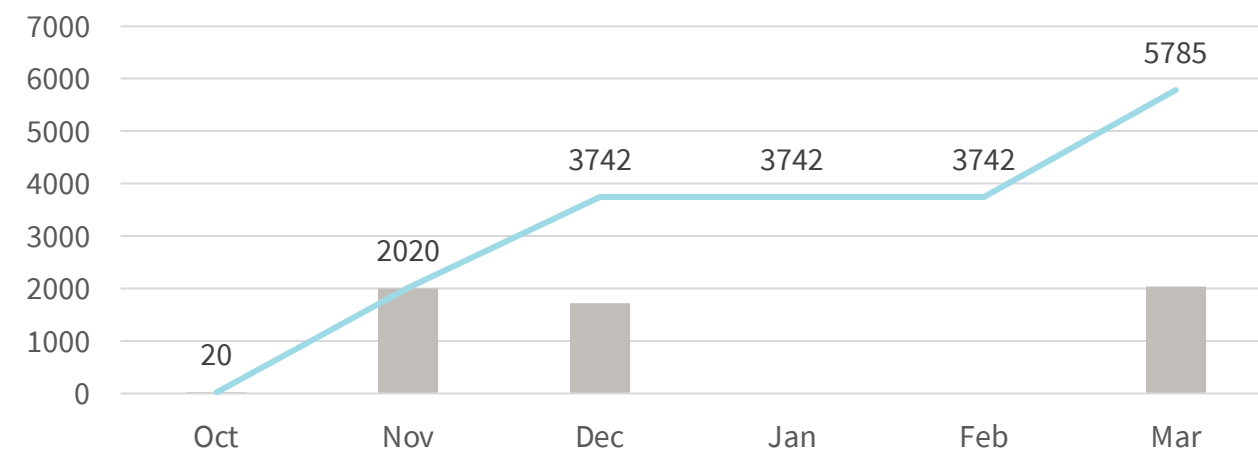

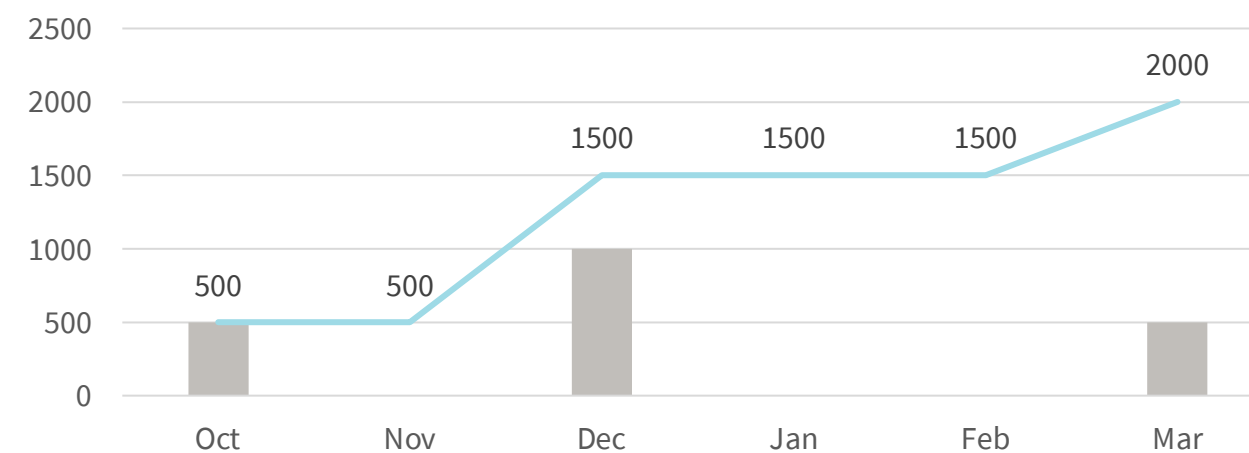
