I experienced working at the reception, the restaurant floor and the coffee pantry. I also spent half of my cross exposure at the kitchens of the bakery. I learnt how to act in a restaurant and kitchen which requires absolute discipline and good grooming as I was the face of the hotel for the customer. I also learnt that the customer always comes first and no matter where you work, cleanliness and safety are paramount. This exposure made my decision to join the hospitality and hotel industry even more firm and resolute. I feel very fortunate to have had this experience.
