- A reminder that we are nut-free school. Nuts and nut products should not be brought to school.




Chinese New Year

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Learning Theme of the week



We will continue to explore the book **We're going on a bear hunt** by Michael Rosen and Helen Oxenbury. We will have a numeracy focus and we will also talk a bit more about bears, real or not real

Vocabulary: Big, small, numbers 1-10, real, not real

Role-play

We will recreate the journey including various obstacles and accompany the children in small groups while encouraging them to talk about what they can see and feel **Vocabulary:** under, over, through, wet, dry, soft, cold, dark

Mathematics

Our mathematical focus this week will be counting bears. How many bears can you see? Can the children find a given amount of bears?

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Vocabulary: How many? Can you find?

Knowledge of the world

We will look at various species of bears and talk about differences and similarities. We will also look at bears from stories and toy bears. Which bear is real?

Vocabulary: real, old, new, colour names



As you become more familiar with tapestry, you will find at the bottom of each observation the development matters statements. We use these on a daily basis and many activities cover several areas of learning. Below are some of the statements we will be focusing on through child initiated learning and our teacher inputs.

Mathematics - Numbers

• Selects a small number of objects from a group when asked, for example, 'please give me one', 'please give me two'.

Understanding the World – The World

- Comments and asks questions about aspects of their familiar world such as the place where they live or the natural world
- Can talk about some of the things they have observed such as plants, animals, natural and found objects.

Dutch
