#### Top Tip!

We have been talking about different habitats and eco systems in Foundation 1, and how they are threatened by pollution and the accumulation of waste such as plastic in the sea. It is important that we are educating our young children in protecting animals in the environment. Our story this week (Sharing a Shell) highlighted this. Sea turtles are another sea creature that is under threat by people's lack of respect towards the natural environment. We ask that at home as parents you discuss this topic with your child and foster in them a sense of care towards the world they live in.
