Our Curriculum

Used by over 30,000 schools in the UK and overseas, the English National Curriculum brings reassurance to parents and stability to students when they move between countries. Split into segments known as "key stages", our school offers education to children aged 3 to 18, covering EYFS, Key Stages 1, 2, 3 and 4.



Our Curriculum

At NAIS, our students follow the EYFS framework, IGCSEs and IB Diploma. With a focus on individualised learning, our rigorous curricula ensures that students have a creative and challenging learning experience.

EYFS

We must always remember that 'play' is a young child's work and that the ground we cover will lead automatically to a readiness for reading, writing and mathematical concepts.

Our well-balanced, carefullyplanned Foundation Stage curriculum will enable your child to progress towards the English national curriculum. Work is planned through the seven areas of learning, where language, numeracy, social, physical, scientific and technological skills are provided for and developed through conversation, discussion, questioning, reasoning, stories, rhymes, books, social play, games and outdoor activities.

The seven areas of the Foundation Stage curriculum are:

- Communication & Language
- **Physical Development**
- Personal, Social and Emotional Development
- Literacy
- Mathematics
- Understanding of the World
- **Expressive Arts & Design**

Primary

Our Primary curriculum is designed to provide the highest academic quality of education.

There is a rigorous development of English and Maths skills while all other subjects are dealt with in a variety of ways using ICT, projects and themes to inspire and challenge children in a child centred approach.

Pupils will be taught Art, Music, Drama, PE and Mandarin by specialist teachers throughout Primary School, and Spanish will be offered from Year 5 upwards.

We have an holistic approach to each child's education to ensure that we are producing well rounded children who are responsible citizens, showing respect and making an effective contribution to society.

Secondary

In Key Stage Three, Year 7 - 9 students follow the English National Curriculum. Class teachers tailor their subjects to take into account the student population and the local environment as well as fostering the skills needed to develop global citizens.

The Curriculum is designed so that students are able to develop skills and knowledge in a wide range of subject areas. The school sets itself high academic standards and has a strong commitment to the delivery of a broad, differentiated and balanced curriculum.

In Key Stage Three, students study the following subjects:

Art & Design, Computing, Drama, English, English as an Additional Language (EAL), Geography, History, Mandarin, Mathematics, Music, PE, Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHEE), Science and Spanish.

Each subject will be taught by a specialist teacher and the approach is often unit-based. For example, the Year 7 Science course covers **Biology, Chemistry and Physics** topics like Cells, Forces and Chemical Reactions.

For students in Key Stage Four, we will prepare them for the University of Cambridge IGCSE qualifications (Year 10-11) and the International Baccalaureate Diploma in senior years (Year 12-13).

Our Collaborations

Exclusive collaborations with the Juilliard School and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) provide an innovative curriculum and approach to learning, which encourages creativity and experimentation.


Your child will follow an innovative embedded arts curriculum created in collaboration with The Juilliard School, a world leader in performing arts education.


imagination to construct a chain reaction machine. Amazing things happen when you blend the natural curiosity of youth with the learning style of one of the world's most influential universities.

Experience MIT

Every spring term, Nord Anglia students will visit MIT to immerse themselves in a culture of handson problem-solving. Your child will meet leading MIT scientists, build and experiment in workshops, and learn about the new discoveries that will shape their future. Activities during the MIT visit include everything from building robots, to bioengineering, to coding. Your child will also have a chance to visit MIT and Harvard allowing them to experience student life at one of these prestigious universities.

Learn from the best

Our STEAM teachers participate in workshops at MIT that expose them to the forefront of STEAM research and thinking. Every summer, Nord Anglia teachers visit MIT to receive hands-on training from MIT researchers and renowned academics. Activities include discussions and workshops with leading engineers and scientists about topics such as climate change, food production technologies, city planning and gaming among other things.







Outstanding Academic Results

Our outstanding academic results are testament to our personalised approach with nearly one in three of our students going to the world's top 100 universities.

We believe passionately in learning, and our modern approach to education continues to help our students shine. Great teachers, committed students and a community spirit that emphasises the rewards from hard work and engagement have delivered world class results once again at every level in the school.

Nord Anglia Education's school life goes beyond grades. We are committed to giving your child the best international school education in Hong Kong, but also to develop respectful, confident and inquiring young adults.

Our high-quality teachers and contemporary approach to learning produce results. Highlights across our family include:

- One in three of our graduates goes on to attend one of the world's top 100 universities, as ranked by QS World University Rankings.
- Our students' average score in the IB Diploma was 34 points, significantly ahead of the 2016 global average of 30.1 points.
- 15% of our students achieved 40 points or more. This is the level of attainment required to gain admission to the world's elite universities such as Cambridge, Oxford, Harvard and Stanford.
- 45.9% of all IGCSE grades achieved by Nord Anglia Education students were at the highest levels of A* or A, more than double the 2015 UK average of 21.2%.
- The percentage of our students achieving 5A* C grades, including English and Maths at IGCSE has risen from 83.1% to 87%, significantly outperforming the 2015 UK average of 64.9%.
- 31% of grades achieved at A level were A*-A. This is 5% higher than the 2016 UK average of 25.8%.
- 42% of scores in the Advanced Placement (AP) exams received a grade of 4 or 5. This is higher than the global average of 38%. Our average AP score of 3.2 is higher than the global average of 3.0.
- 16% of our students achieved the highest honour "Très Bien" in the Baccalaureate Français (BF). This is higher than the national average of 13.4%.

• Our students' pass rate for the Baccalaureate Français is 96%, significantly above the national pass rate of 89% in 2016.
