
Phase of Education

5	Yr 12 and 13	Choice + Core



Structure of (I)GCSE Courses

- 2 year course
- Coursework / controlled assessment in some subjects
- Coursework varies from 0 60% of final grade
- Final examinations in May and June 2022
- Teacher/student/parent partnership
- Importance of meeting deadlines and excellent attendance

How should my child make their choices?

- Not sure, then go for broad and balanced: Sciences (1-2), Humanities(1-2) Languages (1)
 Arts/Creative/Physical(1)
- Choose subjects that you enjoy
- Choose subjects that you are good at
- Consider university/employment plans
- Don't take a subject because of your friends' choices
- Don't pick a subject because you get on well with a particular teacher
- Leading into IB?

Universities

- (I)GCSE: Require C/4 and above
- Consider Country pre-requisites
- Consider faculty pre-requisites
- Recommended that you contact universities directly

How it works

Mathematics & English are compulsory examination subjects. Students must choose ONE subject from the Language and Science blocks. Students then select a further four subjects from the list below.
