

Dealing with negative behaviour in the classroom

Consistency:

- Any serious incidents of negative behaviour come straight KL
- Firstly addressed by the class teacher
- Firm voice we do not shout
- If behaviour continues, teacher addresses it again before we get to the next step. We don't have a certain number of warnings because each child is different.
- If the child is not getting the message go to Year Group Leader ...
- If behaviour continues sent to Mrs Roussell. Parents informed.
- Next step KL. Parents invited in.

Dealing with bus behaviour


Bus rules:



No food, drinks or littering



Be kind, friendly and polite



Listen to adults



Stay in your seat



Wear your seat belt



Use quiet voices

Dealing with negative bus behaviour

Consistency:

- Any serious bus problems straight to Head of School
- Bus aunties have been trained to deal with low level behaviour
- Behaviours forms completed and returned to CT.
- 3 'Bus Misbehaviour Forms' Head of school informed and parents contacted
- If the student receives another 'Bus Misbehaviour Form' within a 4 week period, the parents will be asked to make alternative arrangements to get their child to/from school for 5 consecutive days.
