# Our subject in the Spotlight this week is... English.

Year 7: Moving into the summer term, year 7 are completing their introduction to Shakespeare. They are touching on a range of plays from his tragedies, such as Macbeth, to his comedies, like Twelfth Night. By using drama, creative writing and their growing analytical skills, they will develop their ability to read and understand Shakespeare in preparation for the rest of their Secondary education.

Year 8: Year 8 have recently completed their study of the novel 'Burn My Heart', exploring character development and the presentation of key themes. They are now moving on to analysing poetry and using it to inspire their own writing.

Year 9: Having explored the novel 'The Outsiders' last term, the students have begun this term by preparing to write an essay on the novel under exam conditions. Later in the term, students will begin their study of 'The Merchant of Venice'.

Year 10: Following the successful completion of their second piece of literature coursework, year 10 have returned to exploring poetry in preparation for the exam portion of their iGCSE. The poetry anthology covers a range of poets from the 19th to the 21st century, calling for the students to apply their analytical skills in different contexts.

Year 11: Year 11 are working hard in preparation for their final examinations. The students will be revising texts from the Language Anthology and completing past papers questions in preparation for their language exam, and revisiting their literature texts in preparation for their literature exam.

### Update from IB Coordinator:

This week the students attended the Futures Fair; they had the opportunity to speak to professionals from a wide range of fields and found out more about the routes into different careers. They also started their personal statements, which form a significant part of their applications for tertiary education.
