Humanitarian trip to Madagascar

October 2019

On his visit in September at Collège Champittet, Père Stephano has had the opportunity to talk with the students going on the trip in October and has given a list of necessary goods to bring in their luggage to donate to the *Maison des Enfants'* children. Students have gone from class to class to present their trip and to announce this goods collection. Recipients have been placed at the Vie Scolaire to collect the goods.

More than one thousand goods were collected including school material, hygiene products, clothes, toys (easy board games), stationery products, candies, footballs, volleyballs hairbands and accessories for girls.

Students went to Madagascar in October and had a once-in-a-lifetime experience with the diversity of cultural and humanitarian activities.

They took part in refurbishing the 'Ecole Champittet' in Andrafiabe, a school physically and financially supported by the Foundation Champittet since 2011.

Students spent time daily with orphans from the *Maison des Enfants* in Ambadja. They voluntarily took care of them, chatted, played and danced with them.

Additionally, students visited local food producers, cacao plantations and a natural reserve including a wildlife sanctuary. Along with humanitarian activities, they could dive in the life of the local people and in the atmosphere of the island, enjoying its beautiful sights.
