Hack the Tube





Changing the World, together

Through our collaboration with UNICEF, students research, develop and debate solutions to challenges facing society. Through Global Campus, the impact of our students' ideas and initiatives is extended around the globe.

Global Challenge

Students address the Sustainable Development Goals set by the United Nations, using Global Campus to discuss initiatives to make the world a better place. Past projects range from creating a rooftop garden to fighting pollution to hosting refugee crises workshops with an international aid organisation.

Visual arts competition

To further convey their understanding of the Sustainable Development Goals, students create compelling works of art judged by a panel, including UNICEF representatives. The winning entries are exhibited at the United Nations in New York.
