#### Transition Overview :

- Introduction of Head of Key Stage role to ensure a progressive pathway across KS3.
- Proven track record of smooth transition student and parent voice.
- Participation in multiple transition activities: Science taster lessons, Library transition sessions, tour of secondary school, presentation lead by our student council and current Year 7 students present to Year 6 classes.
- Strong links between primary and secondary transition staff utilising the primary staff's knowledge to ensure the right support is put in place for the students.

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## Expectations of our students:

- Attendance: your first point of contact is the form tutor - illness, absence etc. Extended absences such as holidays must be agreed with Dr Brown first.
- Organisation: planners, Google Classroom and emails to be used effectively.
- High standards of behaviour (rewards and sanctions).
- Ability to work with peers across the year group.
- Take risks.
- Enjoy school life.

## A smooth transition to next year:

- Transition module during 'My World' (PSHE)-(Covering topics such as: new anxieties and organisational skills).
- Reduced 'traditional homework' during the first half term. Students will instead have an extended reading project, maths booklet, MFL vocabulary as well as creating personal development presentations which will be presented at the first Parents' Consultation Day.
- Homework with then be introduced gradually from all subjects after October half term.
- Residential bonding trip for all Year 7 in September (SOPs pending).

## Role of the Tutor Groups:

- During the two transition days the students will spend time in their tutor groups and teaching groups.
- We have a 5 group tutor system across all of KS3. This will provide considerable benefits for students across Key Stage 3 such as:
- 1. Our students will benefit from having two tutors.
- 2. More opportunities to take part in House and vertical competitions.
- 3. Clear pathway throughout KS3 to ensure progress is maximised.



## **Teaching and Learning**

### The role of homework:

- Allow for valuable assessment opportunities & inform future planning.
- Add value to learning and promote progress in a subject.
- Be manageable for students (in terms of workload), whilst also challenging them.
- Homework Allocations:
- The maximum homework allocation per week for a Key Stage 3 student (with reading in addition to this) is:
- English, Maths & Science: 40 minutes;
- All other subjects: 20-30 minutes.
- Students must record 'time spent' on homework in their diary.
- A new homework timetable will be published early in Term 1 to ensure transparency and that homework is manageable.

### A Partnership:

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# Modern Foreign Languages:

- We offer Modern Foreign Languages in the Secondary school.
- French, Spanish and Mandarin.
- All pupils have the chance to learn two languages (unless EAL support is provided)
- Students are strongly encouraged to continue with the language studied in Y6.
- French and Spanish have two periods timetabled per week.
- Mandarin has three periods timetabled per week.
- French Beginner
- Spanish Beginner and non-beginner
- Mandarin More flexibility (baseline assessment used)

Mandarin Pathways & Early Entry:

- Process and pathways in review.
- Opportunities to discuss and feedback in parent forum.

Bahasa Malaysia:

- Compulsory for Malaysian nationals.
- Optional for non-Malaysian nationals.
- 1 hour per week.
- In addition to the two main language choices.

## **Other Useful Information**

#### Lunch

Lunch is at 12.30-1.40 pm every day. There are a number of ECA activities running during lunch time such as sports clubs, music, Student Council etc. Information such as times and dates will be shared with students when they begin Year 7.

#### Locker

Every student is given a locker. It is expected that they use their locker to store their equipment and organise themselves every morning. Large bags with wheels are not allowed, however they can bring them into school and store them in their locker. It is important to note that we suggest students use a number padlock (not a key) on their locker to keep their belongings safe.

#### Homework

All homework should be recorded in the student's planner. They also collect commendations in their planner. Total commendations are given in every Friday and the student with the most commendations wins 'Student of the Week' in Monday's Secondary assembly.
