English

Reading

- Year 5 are reading and studying 'Kensuke's Kingdom' by Michael Morpurgo
- This will include learning and applying the reading strategies of predicting, clarifying, and inferring, summarising, evaluating, questioning and making connections.

Writing / T4W

- Biographies about key leaders during World War II in the Pacific
- Narrative set in World War II
- Students will learn the model text and its features (Imitation).
- Write their own version of the text (Innovation)
- Create their own biographies/stories (Invention) using the skills learnt

Spelling

- Words with 'silent' letters, modal verbs, the suffix *-ment*, adverbs of possibility/frequency and Y5 common exception words.

Handwriting

- Join from the letter r and s and f
- Practising speed, legibility and proportion

Grammar

- Subordinate and relative clauses
- Parenthesis (brackets, dashes and commas)
- Sentence starters and paragraph openers
- Subject-verb agreement and irregular verb tenses

Year 5

Mathematics

Multiplication and division

- Recognise and used squared and cubed numbers
- Use the notation for squared (2) and cubed (3)
- Solve time and money problems involving multiplication and divisions
- To multiply whole numbers by 10, 100, and 10000

Statistics

- Children will read and interpret data from bar charts and tables (including timetables)
- Make comparisons about data
- Present data on a bar graph
- Solve comparison, sum and difference problems using information presented in a line graph
- Collect continuous data and present on their own line graphs

Factors and prime numbers

- Identify multiples and factors, including finding all factor pairs of a number, and common factors of 2 numbers
- Work systematically to find factors of a number
- Know whether a number up to 100 is prime and recall prime numbers up to 19
