STAFF

Throughout the Olympiad we are using a wide network of teachers, support staff and parent volunteers to ensure the event runs smoothly. These staff members will support with scoring, leading events and ensuring all of our students have an enjoyable Academic Olympiad experience.

INSURANCE/MEDICAL

Each participating school is responsible for ensuring their students are covered with comprehensive medical and travel insurance if required. 
A local hospital option can be provided, but note all Chinese hospitals only accept cash and only in some instances foreign credit card payments for medical services will be accepted. Cash is typically the only method of payment at local Chinese hospitals.

WATER BOTTLES

We will be supplying students with a NAE Global Games water bottle in their welcome pack. There will be water coolers around the sports venues for students to fill their bottles. Tap water is not safe to drink so students should only drink verified bottled water.

VALUABLES/SECURITY

Please remind students that they are responsible for the security of their personal belongings at all times. China is incredible safe but theft no matter how safe it is here, does occur sometimes. Teams will have an assigned area where they can store their things, but again it is suggested not bring any electronic items such as IPADS, mobile phones, if these can be left at home or at the hotel.



Academic Olympiad Events

HUMANITIES-History

The Olympiad attendees will answer questions about Ancient Rome. The questions will be divided into the following five categories: Roman Culture, Major Events in Roman History, Roman Rulers and People, Geography of the Roman Empire and the Roman Army. Having your child do some independent research into any (or all) of these areas would help prepare your child for the Olympiad. Learning key dates and events, e.g. that the Great Fire of Rome took place in 64CE, would also help prepare your child for the Olympiad.

HUMANITIES-Geography

In preparation for the Olympiad, your child should make themselves familiar with capital cities, flags and famous landmarks. Having your child do some research into these topic areas would help to prepare your child for the event.

MATHEMATICS

The math competition will consist of 3 different parts: mental math speed challenge, problems solving, and team data analysis. You can help prepare students by reviewing basic addition, multiplication, subtraction and division facts. They also need to know shapes and angles. Practicing individual and group problem solving will also be important. Finally you should review reading and interpreting data.

LOGIC

The Olympiad attendees will answer a range of questions and activities based on problem solving and logical thinking. These will encompass the following areas: solving riddles, chess problems, solving tangram puzzles, rubik's cube challenges and word scrambles. When undertaking these activities, the children will need to use reasoning, write chess notation and approach problems in a logical manner. Having your child undertake activities based on any (or all) of these areas would help prepare your child for the Olympiad and the logic and problem solving areas.
