Year 3 Curriculum Overview



Fashion



Learning is opened through an entry point to engage pupils and assess their current understanding.

Students will be catwalk fashion models, strutting their stuff in their favourite outfits! Prior to the holidays, the Year 3 teachers will share a film where they are the catwalk models. They will each write a short text to describe what they are wearing and this will be read as they walk down the catwalk. Over the holidays, the children will be asked to plan their outfit and write their own text. On the first afternoon back, our Year 3 Fashion Show will take place on Monday afternoon in the auditorium.



At the end of each unit, outcomes are celebrated an exit point

As part of this unit, children will tie-dye a t-shirt or shirt, then decorate it using embroidery and/or applique. Our exit point will be a fashion show extravaganza, where they will showcase their fabulous shirts!

Speaking, Listening & Drama Opportunities

Children will be taught to:

- Listen and respond appropriately to adults and peers
- Ask relevant questions to extend their understanding and knowledge
- Speak clearly and in accurate English

Additionally, there will be hot-seating, freeze framing and other drama opportunities in our Writing lessons, and as part of the Speaking Program, students will present on a subject of their own choosing.

Science

The children will be studying Light.

They will be taught to:

- To recognise that light from the sun can be dangerous
- To recognise that we need light in order to see things
- To recognise that shadows are formed when the light is blocked
- To find patterns in the way that the size of shadows change
- To notice that light is reflected from surfaces

Computing

Students will continue to develop their Computing skills by:

- Logging on to the network by themselves, and trouble-shooting connection issues.
- Using block programming to solve problems.
- Programming robots to perform specified functions.
- Working collaboratively to build structures in Minecraft Education.

Beginners Vietnamese

The children will be taught about:

- Vietnamese fashion
- Ethnic traditional costumes in Viet Nam

PSHE

Students will learn about 'Relationships.'

They will be taught to:
