Year 7: Our Year 7 students have been learning all about the formal elements this week and putting some of these into practice through experimenting with monoprinting. They have also handed in some wonderful TTT homework which will begin their Art History timeline. We have been very impressed by the level of effort that all students put into their work!

Year 8: This term marks the start of Year 8 students understanding how to meet GCSE standards through a project titled 'Human Form'. The students have learnt how to draw from observation and study proportions of the body. Year 9: Students in Year 9 are working collaboratively this term to create large final pieces which have been transcribed from the work of another artist. They are continuing to develop their work in order to meet GCSE style standards and expectations and using their sketchbook to solve any problems that they face during the process.

All students are working hard to create independent, personal projects which meet the highest of our expectations. We have been thoroughly impressed by their maturity and dedication to the course both in and out of lessons.
