ENGLISH

The focus next week will be on punctuation and the use of an apostrophe, the children will sort both nouns and proper nouns and look at the idea of possession. Who the item belongs to?

The children will identify the apostrophe within a text as well as create sentences of their own, also remembering capital letters, full stops and commas if needed.

MATHEMATICS

Over the next few weeks our focus in Maths will be Geometry - Shape and Space; we have already started looking at and naming both 2D and 3D shapes, this will now be extended to looking at the properties of the shapes including edges, faces and vertices.

We will ask the children to identify lines of symmetry and to draw these accurately on a shape or pattern. The children will also use mathematical vocabulary to describe position and movement.

TOPIC

The big idea - From A to B.

Every day people all over the world make different types of journeys – on land, on sea and in the air. To make these journeys we have invented lots of different ways of getting from A to B.

We have already conducted our knowledge harvest and the children have thought of lots of different ideas and questions. Next week we will discuss with the children different types of travel they know, we look at the history of these types of transport and the stages of their development.
