Drop off and collection routines

Circle Time

Circle time is a social skills time in the class, when the children usually sit in a circle together, either on the floor or on chairs. Their teacher is part of the circle, too, and while the teacher will direct the activities, she will encourage the children to speak and interact with each other. Often, an object like a large shell, a ball, a rubber egg or a teddy will be passed around the circle. When a child is holding the object, it's their turn to speak.

The teacher will choose from a range of activities, such as co-operative games, rounds, musical games, drama activities, talking and listening exercises, puppets and masks.

Tinker Table

This is an area of provision where the children are encouraged to build and construct, using a range of resources such as building block and Duplo bricks. It aims to develop their fine motor skills.

Creation Station

This is an area of the classroom where chilren will develop their creative skills, alongside their fine motor skills. They will use resources such as paint, coloured pens and pencils, and art materials like feathers and sparkles.
