



## Teaching, Learning, Curriculum

Children follow EYFS Framework and an adapted Curriculum based on Development Matters

Children learn through play in a free flow environment where they mix with the other classes

2 'base classes' downstairs and 1 upstairs – all have access to everything throughout the day

Children are taught specific skills

Children have specialist lessons – teachers build on these skills in play





- 10:00 Break time
- 10:15 Carpet time (story/song/game)
- 10:30 Busy Learning
- 11:00 Mandarin
- 11:30 Lunch
- 12:15 Quiet time
- 12:30 Busy Learning
- 14:30 Story time
- 14:45- Home time



- Children will rotate around classrooms for Busy Learning and spend time upstairs and downstairs.
- P.E. and Music lessons are taught twice weekly by specialists.
- Mandarin is taught daily.

# **Reporting to Parents**

We understand the importance of sharing your child's progress and achievements with you. Tapestry is crucial for this.

- October a Parents' Evening (a 1:1 meeting with your child's teacher)
- December Mid Year Report
- February/March a Parents' Evening (a 1:1 meeting with your child's teacher)
- June an End of Year written report.



## **Reporting to Parents**

Parents are encouraged to communicate with their class teacher using email.

Staff check email regularly but not always during the teaching day. Urgent communication should be addressed by phone call to the School Receptionist such as changes to pick ups. Changes to bus arrangements please notify the school receptionist, your child's class teacher as well as the bus company.



## **Induction into school for Nursery**

#### Week beginning 19<sup>th</sup> August

- <u>Day 1 (Mon)</u> Small group timetabled session. Children <u>accompanied</u> <u>by parents</u> for a 'Stay and Play' session (<u>1 hour</u>). Meet with class teacher. (New starters only)
- <u>Day 2 (Tues)</u> –Small group timetabled sessions for <u>1 hour</u>. Children stay in class while parents are invited for refreshments.
- Days 3-4 (Wed & Thurs) Children will attend school for an assigned <u>half day</u> session either am/pm
- **Day 5 (Fri)** Children will start their <u>normal school hours</u>. **First day of buses**. If a child is not ready for this big step, then class teachers will meet with parents individually to extend the induction plan.




#### **Gaining Independence – ready for school!**

#### **Preparing your child for Nursery**

- Talk to your child in a positive way about what to expect
- Share 'Welcome booklet for children' (you will receive this via email before the new term)
- Experience of playing with other children
- Following simple instructions and routines e.g. tidying toys. Encourage independence.
- Feeding themselves
- Practise getting dressed/putting on own socks and shoes
- Toilet trained no nappies, but please send a full set of spare clothing to be kept in school





#### **Eating at School**

#### Packed Snack and Lunch

- Children will need a container for snack, a container for lunch and a water bottle.
- Children often prefer lunch boxes with different compartments so that they can have some choice over what they eat.
- Please ensure all of their **belongings are labelled**.
- We want to promote a healthy and balanced diet.
  - We ask for children to not bring in sweets,
    chocolate or fizzy drinks.
- No nuts, including no Nutella or peanut butter
- We also promote eco-friendly practices for snack/lunch.
  - Choose snack/lunch items without single use plastic ('naked lunch').
