Teaching and learning and independent review

IGCSE results 2015:

- 5+ A*-C 83% (UK 53%; BSB 2013 62%)

- A*/A 53% (UK 21%; BSB 2013 33%)

- 5+ A*/A 46% (BSB 2013 17%)

 IB predicted results – with honesty – 100% pass at Full Diploma; average points above global averages (although averages are misleading)

CURRICULUM – WHY THE ENC/IGCSE?

- Programme followed by tens of thousands, not written by individual schools/teachers based on their preferences
- Rigorous, builds year on year, planned from 18 months to 14 years and beyond
- Learn new concepts earlier better transition to other curricula
- Individual subjects, not 'topics'
- Personalised and adaptable, and we adapt it strongly for our international student body
- IGCSE an internationally recognised, formal examination qualification in every subject at age 16, leading well to IB or further study. Strong university and international currency.
 The new National Curriculum assessment programme

- IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) and Middle Years Programme (MYP) are well-established, but....
- Theme-based rather than subject-based, so rely heavily on quality of individual teacher
- Can be very varied in quality quality assurance and benchmarking only at school level
- BSB curriculum guarantees subject specialists for all subjects
- PYP and MYP have no international examination programme to support – reliant on internal school grades with no external value. Students may enter IB Diploma with no examination experience.

STAFFING RECRUITMENT

- Change of Primary Headteacher Mrs Nonie Adams
- Balance of experience with our staff international vs UK
- IB staff over 200 years of experience and 500 days of training whilst at BSB
- Dedicated IB Coordinator at Deputy Head level
- Secondary leadership unchanged for third year running

UNIVERSITY DESTINATIONS AND GUIDANCE

New counsellor and counselling team 2016

This year's destinations and offers:

- 36% received offers from top 50

- 44% received offers from top 100
- 100% of applicants to Russell group received offers
- Notable offers UCL (7), ICL (8), Edinburgh (21), HKUST (28) HKU (30), Manchester (33) and UBC (50)

- plus many highly ranked Art schools

- Visits from universities most recently Oxford and Nottingham, have included London, Ivy League
- Next year's university fair will be at BSB
- The big debate American vs British curriculum; APs vs IBDP; IBDP vs A level
- The British curriculum and IBDP are widely favoured in US universities
