Drama at NAS



A Look at Learning

Pari Manta class meets refugees from HELP



Recently, the Pari Manta class met with and taught a lesson to some students from an organisation called HELP. This organisation helps refugees seeking asylum while waiting in Indonesia to go to countries that will accept them to live permanently.

The lesson was a part of their 'Changing Places, Moving People' topic. The Pari Manta class have been learning about how people are forced to move from one country to another when they feel their safety is threatened. There were 13 children from HELP in the lesson. They were between 11 and 15 years old, and their teacher (also a refugee) was 17!



We introduced ourselves and told them from which countries we had all come. They did the same, and we learned that they had all fled from either Afghanistan or Yemen. We talked about our favourite foods, music, films and sports – we had been learning about these in our topic as cultural indicators. We learned that we had a lot more in common than we thought. We also realised that we were fortunate to have come to Indonesia by choice rather than being forced to by dangerous circumstances in our home countries.

It was an eye-opening experience and helped the children develop empathy and compassion for people less fortunate than ourselves.
