Literacy

We will be learning more about debate and argument. We will be looking at current events going on in the world around us, in conjunction with thinking carefully about our roles as global citizens. Pupils will learn more about expressing their thoughts successfully through structuring and wording an effective argument. In order to do this, we will be looking carefully at formal language and connectives to ensure correct tone; basing arguments in fact rather than opinion; and using a range of sources to gather information, taking into account possible bias. Once pupils are secure in this, we will explore different ways to make their voices heard through various media.

Maths

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We will begin by revisiting division and securing efficient and accurate written methods for all children, and extending those who work confidently with an investigation. For the latter part of the week we will look at data handling, and specifically reading and creating line graphs. Some pupils will also begin looking at finding measures of central tendency from data.

Themed Learning

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'World War 2'

In Themed Learning we will continue our exploration into World War 2 by developing our understanding of evacuation. We will discover how and why evacuation took place and who was most affected by this event. We will discuss the Blitz in more detail and try to empathise with those who were badly affected in areas of aircraft bombing. We will introduce the major event of 'Rationing' and begin to discuss how the people who were operating on the Home Fronts of different countries collaboratively worked to make life as manageable as possible.

PHSCE

Students will consider the impact of the holocaust and discuss the issue of persecution facing populations in present times.
